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Blackwood on Bridge

By Easley Blackwood

Before you can fully understand the Humanics of bridge you must have a firm grasp of the fundamental mathematics of the game. Now don't shy away. This won't hurt a bit—just a little simple arithmetic that is absolutely essential for winning play.

When you make a game or a partial, remember that you have earned not only the score you down on the score sheet but you have also made some progress toward a bonus—the bonus for winning the rubber.

Add these to the 120 actual trick points and, from the mathematical point of view, Mr. Masters scored 470 points in all.

This is modified slightly by the fact that he is now vulnerable and cannot be so active in defensive bidding as can his opponents. This reduces his profit by about 50 points. So let's say he scored a little more than 400 points by making the game.

Here is the practical application. Whenever you figure you have one chance in three to make game on a hand, go ahead and bid it—because of the liberal rubber bonus which you are always aiming for.

Mr. Dale has tremendous confidence in Mr. Masters and he bid rather optimistically. But his optimism paid off.

Mrs. Keen opened the queen of diamonds which Mr. Masters ducked, hoping to keep Mr. Abel out of the lead. Mr. Abel was asleep at the switch. He should have overtaken the queen of diamonds and led the queen of clubs through Mr. Masters' king. But he didn't and Mrs. Keen continued with another diamond. Mr. Masters won with dummy's ace, took two rounds of trumps, trumped his last diamond in dummy and then led the jack of hearts, letting it ride.

Mrs. Keen won with the queen and now there is no way to defeat the contract. The ace of clubs was cashed and that was all. If Mrs. Keen had returned
