

And if, the hospital insurance department "doesn't come across with a check" by end of month, "we'll be owing a \$9000 payroll," he told the board.

About 90 per cent of patients admitted to the hospital are covered by hospital insurance, he said, and these accounts are submitted daily to Victoria for monthly payment.

Meanwhile, the hospital has been operating at a loss since beginning of this year-with a total deficit of \$7500.

"Our \$8 a day rate just doesn't cover operating expenses," said Mr. Stevenson.
