EDSON, Alta. (C)—Mayor W. H. Kankewitt waved his arm expansively over his prosperous town. "We're not a boom town like Edmonton," he said. "I hope we never will be."

But for all that Edson, 1951 in population by this year's census estimate, may well turn out to be.

Half way between Edmonton and Jasper, Alta., this steadily-growing town is the only sizable settlement between those better-known places. It has added almost half to its population in 10 years—a growth inspired by no single factor.

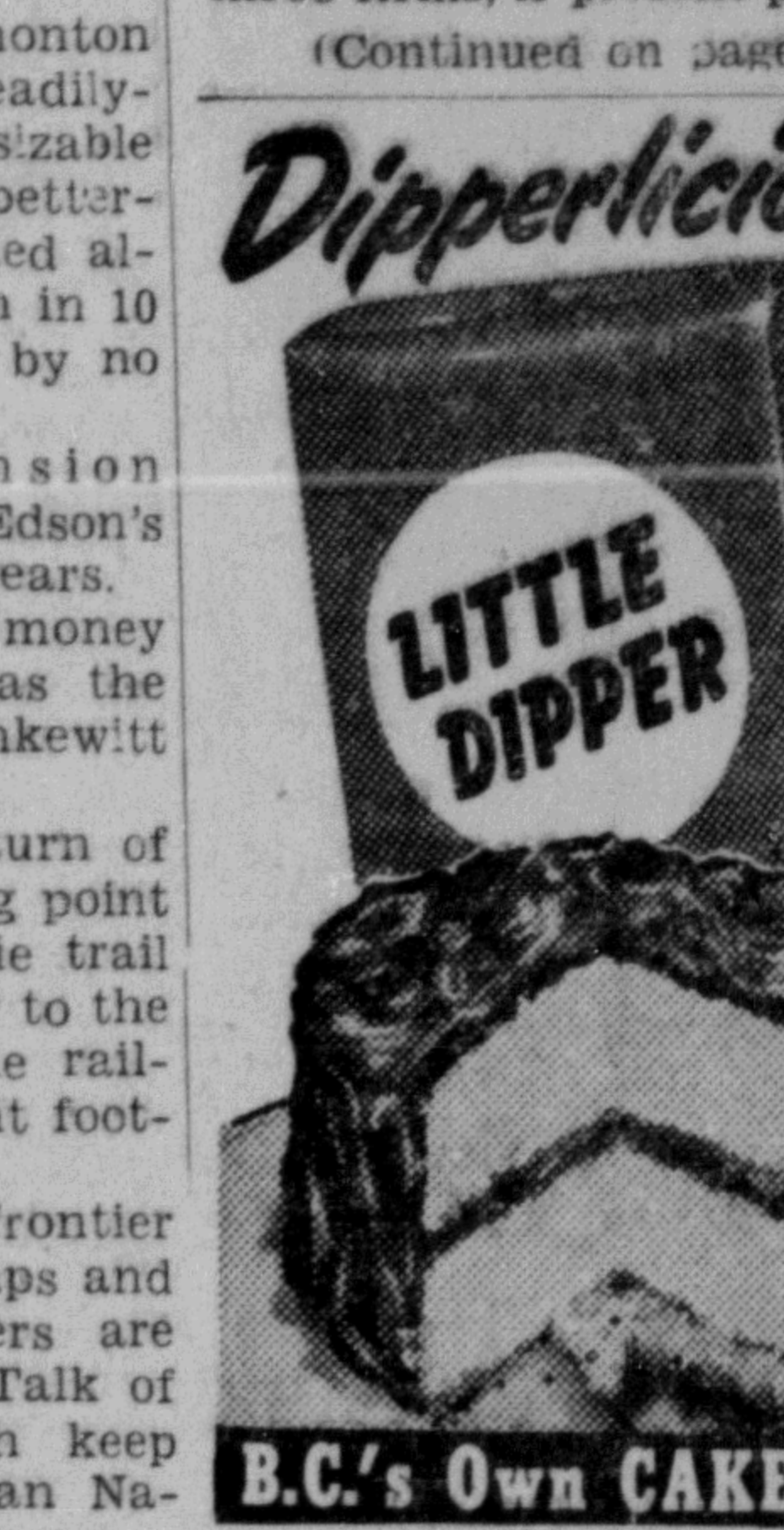
