**Rusty Thain Shows How at** McClymont Park

An object lesson was given to swimmers yesterday afternoon at Gyro Pool when lifeguard Miss Rusty Thain had to bring a victim of cramps from the water. The swimmer, it was found later, had just finished eating a meal and had not been swimming for several years.

'First important thing for all swimmers to remember is not to swim for at least one full hour after eating,"says Ian McHardy, swimming pool supervisor and instructor. Second cardinal point in water safety is "not to dive directly into cold water if you have been away from swimming for some time."

Swimmng can be one of the most enjolable forms of recreation there is but, like in most sports, common sense precautions must be taken. Included in these are: Never swim alone.
