Richard to Break Mark

Rocket Expected to Exceed Neils Stewart's Scoring Record
 HUMMERSTONE, Ont. ©—The man who could care the most—but doesn't—says Rocket Richard can't miss cracking the National Hockey League's lifetime goal-scoring record before the season ends.
 Neils (Old Poison) Stewart—whose 324-goal total is what Richard is shooting at—figures Richard's name will go into the record books ahead of his before long.
 "From the blue line in, there isn't any better than Richard," said Stewart, whose own reputation as a star in 15 seasons of play was built on his ability to get the puck into the net.
 Now living in almost complete retirement from hockey in this Niagara district town, Stewart said the Montreal Canadiens' great right wing would have starred in any hockey era.
 "Today's game is made to order for him. He's got the brain. He doesn't back-check much—but then, neither did I. Some players have to wind up, but not the Rocket. He gets started on a dime, is awfully strong and also bulls his way in."
 Stewart, almost as noted for his reluctance to check as for his scoring skill, says he couldn't miss in the modern brand of hockey.
 "All the play now is from the blue line in. You could take a wheel chair in."

HOWE MORE USEFUL
 He entered the controversy over hockey's greatest modern right wing by saying that for all Richard's goal-scoring skill, Gordie Howe of Detroit Red Wings is a better two-way player and more useful to a team. Howe, he thinks, is the Howie Morenz type.
 "They don't come like Morenz very often—about once in a century," he said when asked whether Richard was greater than the late Stratford Streak. Morenz was named in a Canadian Press poll last winter as the greatest hockey player of the half-century.

"He had everything—could rush, score goals and back-check. You couldn't put the Rocket in the same breath as Howe—and that goes for everybody else, including Bill Cook. None of them was in the same stable."
