**Prairies Get Too Much Rain**

WINNIPEG—Harvesting weather has been unfavorable over most of the prairie provinces during the past week with showers or heavy rains reported from many sections, according to the Weekly Crop Report of the Department of Agriculture of the Canadian National Railways. Intermittent operations have been carried on depending on the degree of rainfall. Many points which had just resumed operations had to stop because of further showers. Rains occurred the night of Sept. 12. They were heaviest in Northern Manitoba and northeastern Saskatchewan and lighter elsewhere. These intermittent showers, however, cause further delays and prevent harvesting operations from becoming general over widespread areas. The major requirement of Western Canada is warm dry sunny weather. The threat of frost cannot be discounted in all

sections where the crop is late. Weather was cooler in the Okanagan Valley where the peach movement will be completed this week-end. Prunes will be moving next week. Bartlett pears are nearly finished and the movement of Flemish pears has commenced. D'Anjou pears will not be on the market for another three weeks. Grapes are now moving and McIntosh apples will commence moving this week-end. Practically all fruit crops will reach estimates previously reported.

**Britain Stops Iran Shipments**

LONDON—Great Britain this week stopped British ships from delivering cargoes to Iran. A Board of Trade spokesman disclosed that vessels carrying "certain scarce materials to Iran have been diverted." He said this was in line with a British Treasury statement earlier this week cancelling financial and economic concessions to the Tehran government. Breakdown of Anglo-Iranian talks for settling of the oil nationalization dispute brought about the British squeeze on Iran.

**New Vault Tough Job**

A three-ton steel door was a tough job to stand upright and place into the vault entrance in the Canadian Bank of Commerce building and Bank Manager Edward Boulier is happy that the work is nearing completion. In line with expanding business, a new vault was found necessary. The huge streamline model, with double locks, arrived in Vancouver aboard SS Parma, direct from London via the Panama Canal route. It was landed here last week by Princess Nora.

LONDON—Hospital authorities examining a man charged with attempted suicide found he had swallowed pins, needles, broken glass, cufflinks, studs, buttons, flashlight bulbs, pieces of tin, paper clips and wool. He hit the ceiling. "What else can happen to me in this rubber?" he roared, waving his arms in the air.

**Refusing to Re-Arm Japan**  
TOKYO—Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida, who guided Japan along the road to independence, told his people Friday he will refuse to rearm his country. His stand was viewed in some quarters as indicating he would step out of office as soon as the United States-Japanese security pact becomes law. He instructed his countrymen to keep faith with the western world. Observers predicted Yoshida will resign in favor of Hatoyama, founder of a new party, who was recently elected.
