Minister of Education W. T. Straith, K.C., visiting Prince Rupert, said in an interview that British Columbia schools "have the largest percentage of attendance in Canada."

"And more children take higher grades," he said, quoting figures where, in the rest of Canada 27 per cent of school children completed grade XI, 50 per cent completed the grade in B.C.

The average "leaving age" of a student in B.C. is 17 years, eight months, Mr. Straith said.

In the last four years \$42,000,000 had been spent in new school building by the education department, and 250 new schools and additions had been completed. Last year eight million was spent; this year, seven millions are slated for new schools as part of the department's education program.

The figure is lower this year because of the restrictions made necessary by the international emergency, Mr. Straith said.

Women Are Superfluous

This Situation and Many Refugees Leaves Mark in West Germany

BONN (Reuters)—Six years of war, 3,000,000 "superfluous" women and 10,000,000 refugees in West Germany have left deep marks on German family life.

One marriage in six in West Germany today ends in divorce. They are more frequent in towns than in the country.

Marriages between 1942 and 1944 have proved the least stable. Nearly half of all war-broken marriages have lasted less than 10 years.

The presence of children has little effect upon the durability of marriages, say German statisticians who find that 38 per cent of broken marriages are childrenless, compared with 43 per cent before the war.

Only fourteen per cent of divorces are granted on the ground of adultery. The usual grounds are "other offences against marriage" including sexual irregularities and what the law calls "the break-up of the marriage community."

Divorces are private affairs; nothing may be published about them in the press.

Statisticians estimate that about one-half of all married Germans are unfaithful to their wives. Even among women there is much more unfaithfulness than before the war.

An increasing number of married women, estimated at between 10 and 16 per cent, are unable to bear children, while three per cent of all babies are born dead.

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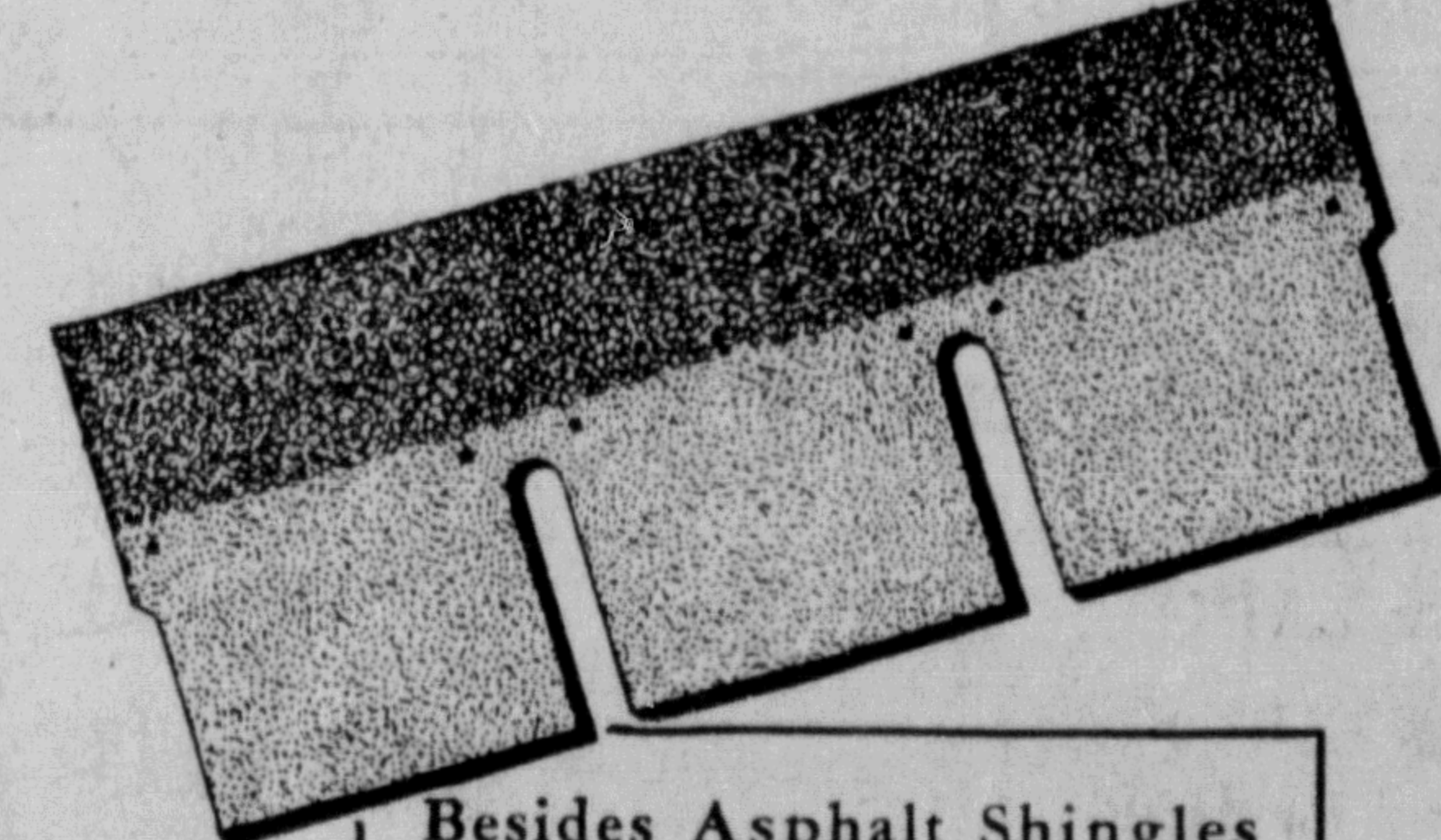
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
