When the dummy hand went down after Mr. Meek's opening diamond lead, Mr. Muzzy was delighted. "You can relax partner," he remarked happily. Having played with Mr. Muzzy before, Miss Brash did not take this cheering remark too seriously.  
What was it that Mr. Muzzy liked so much about the dummy hand? It was the singleton club. He loves to ruff losers. It is his greatest pleasure to find a singleton (a sneak, he calls it) in his hand and the dummy, too—so that he can cross-ruff.  
Here is the way Mr. Muzzy figured this hand—one spade loser, two diamond losers, period. He figured no club losers because dummy had a singleton club and "some trumps."
