## Terrace Hospital Crisis —Red Cross Withdrawing

Outpost No Longer Considered Adequate—Community Must Take Over

TERRACE.—The fate of the local Red Cross Outpost Hospital is to be decided at a public meeting called for Tuesday evening next when Col. Scott, British Columbia commissioner, and W. MacDonald, president of the British Columbia division of the Canadian Red Cross Society, will arrive in town from the south to make arrangements for its disposal.

The increased industrial activity in the district and the increasing population has created a situation where an Outpost Hospital, as such, can no longer fill the needs of the ever-expanding town.

Converted from army buildings—which were formerly the Brigade Headquarters—at a total cost of \$25,000 the hospital is fully equipped with an operating room, sterilizing room, case room, nursery and X-ray room, one 4-bed men's ward, two semi-private wards, one private room and an isolation ward, besides the usual nurses' and help quarters, kitchen, laundry etc.

The hospital was opened in 1948. At that time the town was given five years to pay its share of the cost—\$5,000. A Committee was formed and the total sum subscribed in less than three years. Now the hospital is to be closed unless the town steps in and takes it over.

Colonel Scott telephoned the secretary of the local branch of the Red Cross to make arrangements for a public meeting to discuss these matters which are vital to the welfare of the town.

Old time friends from Prince Rupert have met J. "Denny" Allen, one of this city's "originals." Mr. and Mrs. Allen, who moved to Victoria years ago, are well and are interested in gardening.
