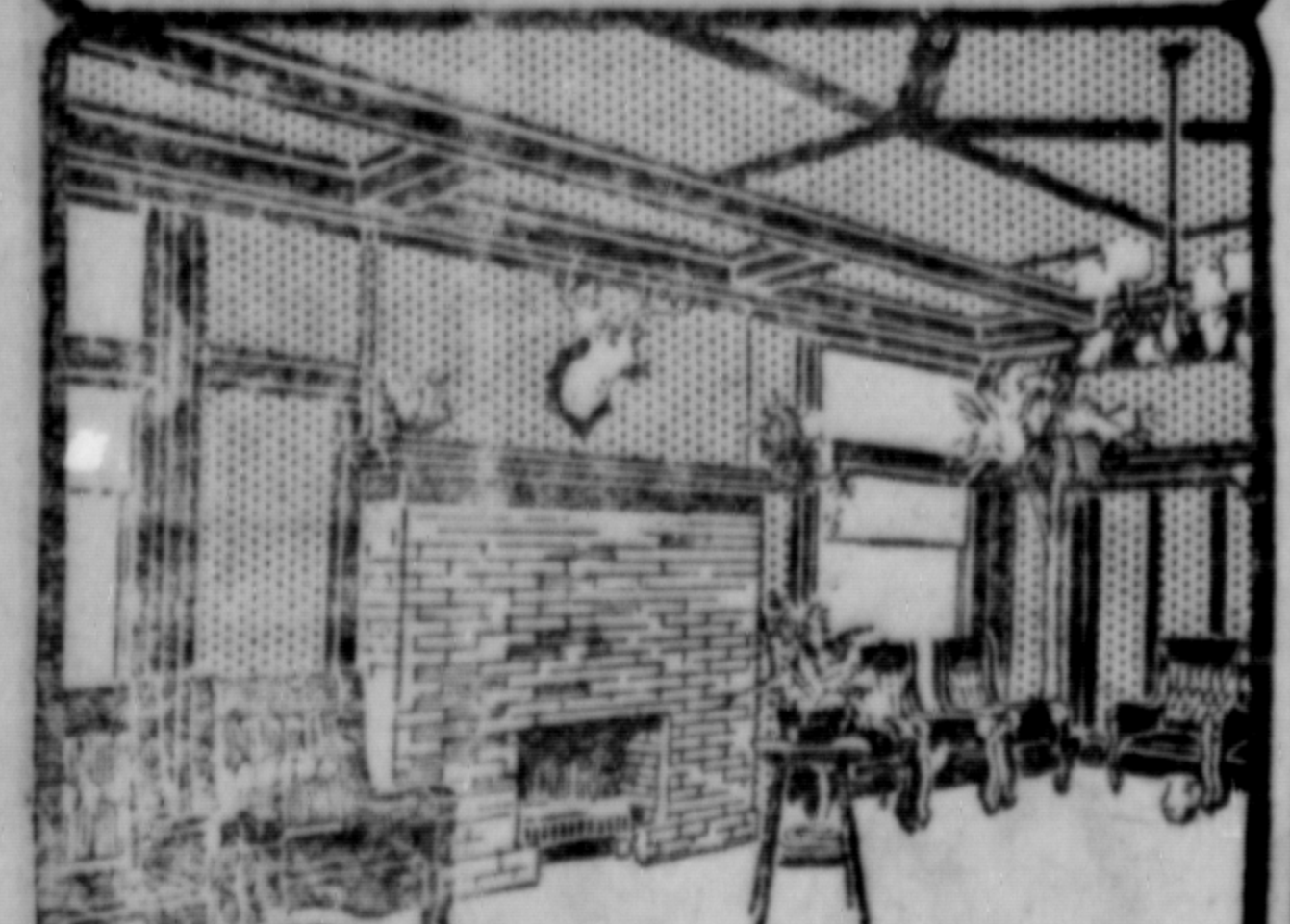

SIR SAM HUGHES ARRAIGNS THE COMMANDERS

Alleges That There Was Needless
Loss of Life at Cambrai
and Says Why.

(Special by G. T. P. Telegraphs.)

Ottawa, Sept. 30.—Private
members day in the House of
Commons was productive of de-
bate on several topics, including
the conduct of operations of the
Canadian forces in France.

Criticism of the military opera-
tions in France was made by Sir
Sam Hughes. The ex-minister
spoke for over two hours and
touched on some new matters.
He referred to the operations be-
fore Cambrai on Sept. 29, 1918.

It is charge was that the higher
command was responsible for the
heavy loss of life in sending both
the infantry and artillery for-
ward into machine gun nests which
should previously have been
closed with tanks. The result
was, Sir Sam claimed, heavy
losses and a retirement, the ob-
jective not being taken until Oc-
tober 10.

Major General Griesback of
West Edmonton, and Col. C. W.
Peck, V.C., of Skeena, both of
whom were at Cambrai, asked the
ex-minister some questions which
seemed to be in disagreement
with his assertions, but no one
replied to the speech.

GITSEN TRIBE INDIAN CREST

Famous Carved Stone Problem
Has Been Solved by W.
Beynon of Victoria.

W. Beynon, of Victoria, has
been investigating the native
carved stone that was discovered
recently at Kispixox. It was dug
up by some workmen who were
making a road and thrown to one
side with the rest of the dirt and
rock. A native woman who was
passing saw it and told her peo-
ple about it and they came with
horse and rig and took it with-
out saying anything.

Mr. Beynon says that there is
nothing prehistoric about the
stone. It is the crest of the Git-
sen tribe of Indians and on one
of the totems at Kispixox is found
the same emblem.

It was a rather difficult matter
looking up the history of the
stone. Mr. Beynon visited the
district and took no apparent in-
terest in the new find. He went
to the older people and talked to
them about their early history
and traditions and got them to
sing their dirge songs in which
the traditions of the tribes are re-
counted. In some of these dirge
songs the two stones are men-
tioned, the crest, the history of
which he was investigating and
the big stone on which the slaves
were sacrificed.

Mr. Beynon says that the stone
will be the excuse for a good many
celebrations during the coming
winter and the village possessing
it will come in for a good many
presents, and much honor. That
is the chief reason why they re-
fuse to part with it. It was
brought to its present site when
the Indians migrated years ago
and is probably several hundred
years old.

GOES SOUTH FROM PRINCE GEORGE ON COLLECTING EXPEDITION

Wm. Rindsfoos, president of
the Brunson Savings and Loan
Co., and K. Thompson, of Colum-
bus, Ohio, are in the Barkerville
country, south of Prince George,
on a big game hunt, and for the
purpose of obtaining specimens
of big game native to that coun-
try for the Smithsonian Institute
at Washington, D. C.

Two years ago Mr. Rindsfoos
visited the Smokey River country
north of Jasper and Mount Rob-
son parks and was successful at
that time in collecting a splendid
lot of specimens. On that occa-
sion Mr. Rindsfoos saw the mol-
lowing number of animals within
shooting distance: 66 caribou, 80
moose, 165 sheep, 19 goat, 2
grizzly, 1 eagle, 6 deer, 14 coyote
and 2 fox.

This is Mr. Rindsfoos' fifteenth
year to visit the Canadian Rockies
in similar expeditions.
