Mr. Dale plays just as carefully at a part score  
contract as he does when playing for a game or a  
slam. He knows those partial scores can be valuable  
in many ways. They not only shorten the road to  
game. They put the enemy in a disadvantageous po-  
sition. Notice the careful play Mr. Dale gave this  
hand.

Mr. Meek opened the queen of  
clubs. Mr. Abel dropped the six  
spot, his second highest, and the  
king in the closed hand won the  
trick.

Now Mr. Dale led the deuce of  
diamonds to dummy's ace and

played back the three of dia-  
monds on which Mr. Abel threw  
the ten. Here the old boy went  
into a huddle. He had practi-  
cally nothing to go on but he  
finally decided to duck and play  
Mr. Meek for an original holding  
of the king doubleton.

He didn't duck by playing the  
four of diamonds. He unblocked  
by playing his nine. This  
thoughtful manoeuvre was the  
key play of the hand.

Mr. Meek won with the king  
of diamonds and ran the rest

of his clubs. On the long club  
Mr. Dale discarded two small  
spades and the five of hearts  
from dummy and the seven and  
trex of hearts from his own  
hand. Mr. Abel shed the jack of  
diamonds and the four of hearts.

Mr. Meek then shifted to the  
jack of spades. Dummy played  
low and Mr. Abel ducked, per-  
mitting Mr. Dale to win with  
the king. Now the queen of dia-  
monds was cashed and, because  
the nine of diamonds had been  
carefully unblocked on the sec-  
ond lead of the suit, Mr. Dale  
was able to get to the dummy  
by leading his four of diamonds  
to dummy's eight.

He took the heart finesse and  
when it worked the contract was  
home. If Mr. Dale had played  
carelessly and had failed to  
make the unblocking play,  
eventually he would have had  
to lead away from his own  
hand, thus losing another trick  
—and his contract.

## New Zealand Pays Bonus To Parents

WELLINGTON, N.Z. (C)—Offi-  
cials are hard at work giving  
effect to the New Zealand gov-  
ernment's novel decision to use  
part of its budget surplus to give  
a bonus payment to parents. The  
extra payments are expected to  
be distributed in July.

New Zealand already pays  
about \$2 a week to parents ir-  
respective of financial position,  
on account of each child regard-  
less of the number. The bonus  
of about \$15 however will be paid  
to a somewhat wider group, af-  
fecting about 600,000 children in  
255,000 families. It will go to  
parents or guardians of all  
children under 16 and to certain  
additional categories as well.

Buoyant revenues provided a  
surplus of \$25,270,000 in the ac-  
counts of the last fiscal year. A  
large part of this will be used to  
establish a war emergency ac-  
count, but the balance will go  
for the child bonus.

Explaining the decision to  
make the extra family allowance  
payment Prime Minister Sidney  
Holland said: "The world-wide  
inflationary trend and competi-  
tion for scarce materials con-  
tinue to cause all price levels to  
rise. We have had substantial  
increases in wages, greatly in-  
creased government subsidies  
and increases in social security  
benefits. Now, in view of the  
extremely buoyant condition of  
the country's finances, the gov-  
ernment is making the bonus  
payment to parents."

## Crop Prospects Are Improved

WINNIPEG — Crop prospects  
improved appreciably during the  
past week owing to good rains  
which occurred throughout cen-  
tral and southern sections of the  
three prairie provinces, accord-  
ing to the weekly crop report of  
the department of agriculture of  
the Canadian National Railways.

Some seeding continues at  
scattered points in Manitoba  
and Saskatchewan, this being  
due to reseeding and frost dam-  
age or by reason of wild oats  
infestation. Seeding of coarse  
grains continues in Alberta with  
about 20 percent of these grains  
still to be sown.

With the warmer weather of  
the past few days growth is now  
rapid and, while weeds are  
fairly general, crops have a very

healthy appearance. Fear of  
uneven germination of late sown  
crops has been generally dis-  
persed because of recent rains.

Only one light shower occurred  
in the Okanagan Valley where  
temperatures have been fairly  
cool. No damage to tree fruit  
crops is reported but the season  
appears to be a little later than  
last year.

The present estimate on apples  
is approximately 6,750,000 boxes  
for fresh market which is about  
10 percent or 12 percent lower  
than last year. Other tree fruit  
estimates remain at previous  
figures. Vegetable crops are pro-  
gressing favorably with slight  
damage reported from cutworms.


