One of the trains represents the delivery of raw materials to the plant (bauxite-the ore of aluminum-from British Guiana, Cryolite from Greenland and Fluorspar from Newfoundland). The other train represents delivery of ingots and semifabricated forms of aluminum from the plant to manufacturers

of finished aluminum products. A selectro-slide enclosed in a case in the foreground projects colored pictures onto a screen in the background, telling the aluminum story of "Mine to Metal."
