Victory Loan, 1919,
Campaign to Commence.

The Victory Loan campaign for this year is about to be launched. The Dominion Government is appealing to the country for funds to carry on the affairs of the country during reconstruction days. An immense sum is needed to pay gratuities to the soldiers, to re-establish them in civil life and to finance British purchases of supplies in this country.

Last year the people of the country rallied to the support of the Government in the matter of finances. They over-subscribed the loan and since that they have been drawing interest on the bonds.

Money is needed almost as badly today as it was a year ago. We, as a country, have not yet got back to normal. We are spending much more than we can possibly collect in taxes and this condition will continue for at least another year, possibly more.

There is nothing political about this loan. It is money that is needed no matter what Government is in power. The foreign and British money markets are almost closed to us and we must raise what cash is needed right here at home. The security is of the best, the interest rate is reasonable and the purchase of a few bonds means having something stable on which to depend for income. In addition to that the bonds are good collateral at the bank, should emergency arise.

It is to be hoped that Prince Rupert people will do their bit again. They are not asked to make any real sacrifices for there is no better way of investing savings than in putting it into government bonds such as those about to be offered.

Baseball is King
During This Week.

Baseball is king throughout the United States and Canada this week. The American sport is followed more closely by many than any other news feature and some people get very excited over the results. Even those who have affected to despise baseball as a game only for the peanut-chewing crowd, are becoming enthused and find themselves eagerly looking for the scores. Liberal Unionists
A Separate Entity.

The separation of the Liberal Unionists and the holding of a caucus as a separate entity is a phase of politics rather unlooked for. The despatches yesterday gave the intimation that there was a possibility that the caucus might have done something else than support the Government. In future they will be looked upon as a separate force to be reckoned with and a force that holds the balance of power in the Dominion Parliament.

It is pointed out by some of those who have studied the situation that there is at present a Liberal majority in the Dominion House of Commons and that it is only by virtue of the support of a part of that Liberal majority that the present Government retains power. It holds the position that the Irish party at one time held in the British House of Commons.
