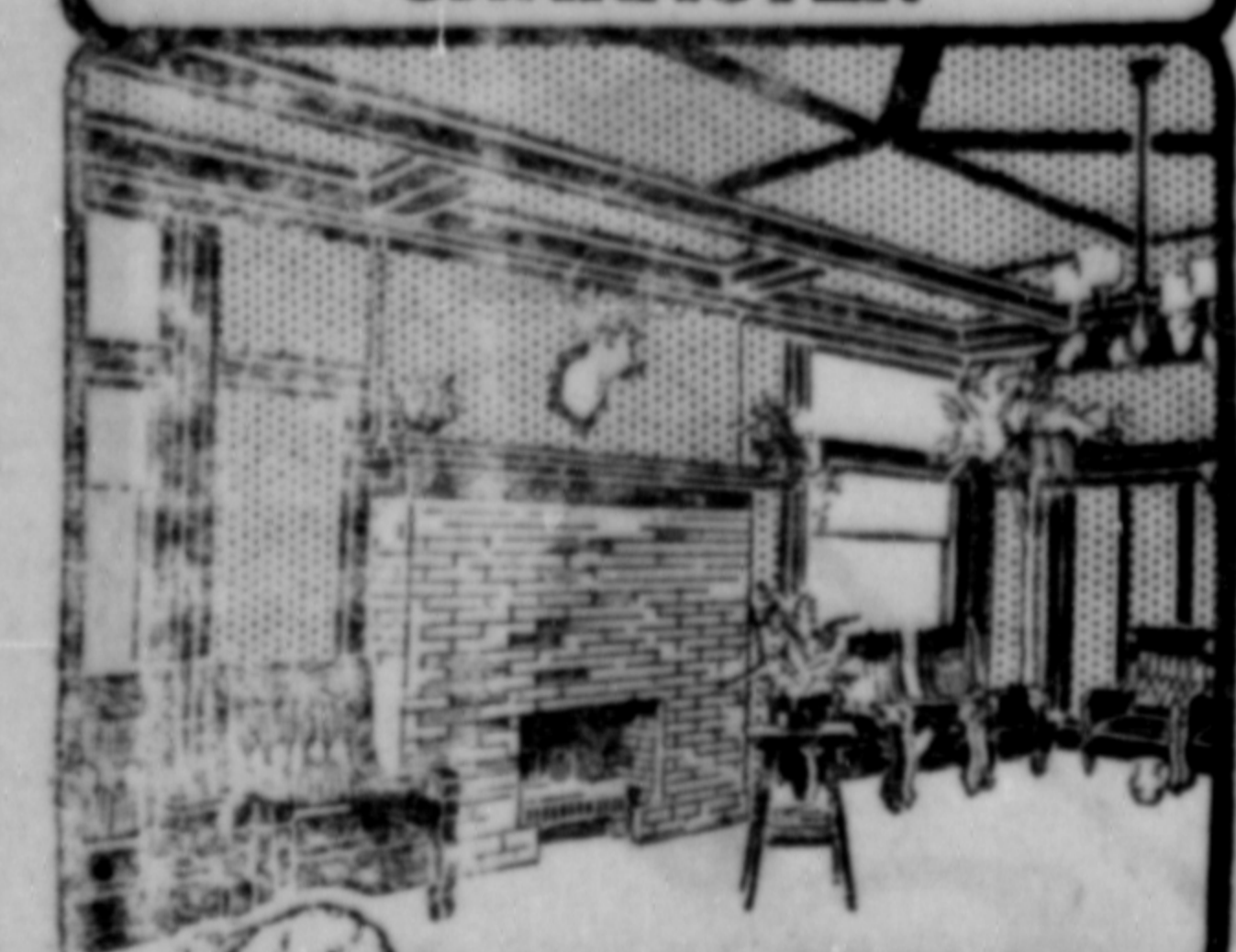

Both teams started short-handed and the losers played with ten men throughout the entire game. The first half provided very even play in which both back divisions showed up well. Willisroft opened the scoring from a rally in goal.

The second half was not long begun when Tommy Black scored with a beautiful effort, after winding through the defence in his own elusive way. It was one of the best goals scored during the whole season. Willisroft added a third tally to the quota by a dash in on Clementson.

For the winners Tommy Black starred forward, George Sellars played to him well, Jack Kelly strove valiantly at half and Bill Murray at back was up to his usual form. For the losers the defence did the better work, Eddie Briggs and Charlie Watman both putting up a strong defence to stay the advance of the Scots. While Clementson made a number of good saves, Sid Hardy played a good individual game forward but the attack rather lacked concerted effort.
