including the United Kingdom and other European sources.

For the first three months of 1952, Canada has requested an allotment of 528,000 tons from the United States and has been promised only 415,000, but part of this will be used for the production of component steel parts in the United States to be shipped into Canada into finished products. The actual amount of unfinished steel that Canada may obtain from American sources may total "less than 300,000 tons," said Mr. Harris.

"That won't be enough, even for our priority needs," said Mr. Harris. "We will have to make another attempt to have the United States increase the allotment."

Meanwhile, while the government attempts to untangle the steel shortage, Canadian industry is going full steam ahead with its expansion program. Here is how part of the program is shaping up:

Sault Ste. Marie, Ont.—Algoma Steel is expanding its rate capacity from 1,000,000 tons to 1,250,000 tons by 1953, investing some \$40,000,000.

Hamilton, Ont.—Steel Company of Canada is working on a 600,000-ton expansion, to boost rate capacity from 1,246,500 to 1,896,500 tons, investing \$50,000. Dominion Foundries has changed over to a blast furnace, allowing the use of hit pig iron instead of cold pig iron, decreasing the melting time and accelerating rate of production.

Sydney, N.S.—Dominion Steel and Coal Company is constructing two new open-hearth furnaces and increasing rate capacity by 100,000 tons a year.

Besides these major expansions, smaller ones are being developed by the Atlas Steel Company at Welland, Ont., and by two rolling mill companies, at Selkirk, Man. and Vancouver. These, also, will add to Canada's generally brighter steel picture in 1953.
