## SUNDAY GAMES IN ENGLAND

Writer in London Daily Mirror Says Very Soon They will be Everywhere Throughout the Country.

It is not at all a rash prophecy to say that very soon Sunday afternoon will be the great time for playing outdoor games in this country, says William Pollack in the London Daily Mirror.

Without fuss or advertisement the movement to this end has gone on, gathering strength and fresh adherents everywhere. People who a few years ago refrained from playing lawn tennis on Sunday afternoons now go forth in hannels and with rackets. Three months ago P. F. Warner, the Middlesex cricketer, presided over an enthusiastic meeting called to discuss the formation of a Sunday Games Association.

A Bishop has publicly approved of Sunday games in a recent newspaper article; and the other day the Brentham (Ealing) Garden Suburb decided to permit organized play on its recreation ground on the Sabbath.

This last decision was come to as the result of a referendum taken on the subject, an example that other communities faced with the question of Sunday games should follow.

**Local Vote**  
 In many places the matter has got beyond academic discussion and shall be settled by vote. Local susceptibilities must not be permitted to override local desires. So-called old-school Sabatarians must not take to themselves the complete right to rule the roost; they must be prepared to bow to the spirit of the times if needs be.

The very same remarks which Captain P. F. Warner made at the meeting just referred to are worth quoting here. During the war games after church hours on Sunday were the rule throughout the Army, he said. The men who had played these games would expect to continue them in civil life.

**A Dull Day**  
 At present Sunday in this country is rather a dull day. He was, he added, "dead against games during church hours, but after church hours he failed to see that healthy recreation was different from reading or smoking. We must get rid of our puritanical ideas about Sunday and give the boys a chance.

There is no doubt that some of the old notions about what is right and what is wrong on Sunday are dying fast, and that before long the playing of outdoor games will be a recognized thing, evoking no scandalized or condemnatory comment.

**Bishop Welldon**  
 "Speaking for myself," wrote Bishop Welldon lately, "although Sunday has always been to me a day not-wearisome or irksome, but delightful, yet, as recognizing that it is the excellence of the citizen's whole nature, in body, in mind, and, above all, in spirit, that ought to be the true object of the State in such legislation as may affect the observance of Sunday, I should not feel able to condemn unreservedly athletic sports on Sundays."

Common sense could not have it otherwise; and so long as Sunday games do not clash with church going, and do not involve the employment of others than those playing them for reasons of health and enjoyment, their growth is all to the national good.

A Sunday afternoon spent in playing lawn tennis or cricket or football or golf is better than one given up to idling indoors, or playing cards, or listening to the mischievous cackle of a Bolshevik "park" orator.

## NEW NAME FOR THE MOUNTED POLICE

Will in Future be Royal Canadian Mounted Police if Bill Before the House Passes.
