A Souvenir.

Mr. Edmunds brought a very interesting souvenir from Hazelton when he arrived last night, in the form of an old B. S. A. breaching rifle of the 1872 model. The gun was used by the Imperial soldiers in the early pioneering days of the Hudson's Bay Co. in fighting and guarding against the hostile Indians. It is a very formidable weapon, being over five feet long and having a bore of three-quarters of an inch. A bayonet measuring 2 1/2 feet also accompanies the rifle.
