ARGENTINA TO HOLD

Buenos Aires.—A group of Argentinian teachers recently met under the auspices of the Free College of Higher Studies in this South American capital, to study rural education and the methods recommended by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.

Drain beet; reserve one-half cup liquor. Combine with sugar, onion, salt, pepper, oil, vinegar and beet liquor. Cover. Marinate over night in refrigerator. Arrange in lettuce cups. Top each serving with a mound of cottage cheese. Serve with French dressing. Six servings.

Expert Goes
To Mexico

MEXICO CITY.—The lessons learned by New Zealand in running a "trouble-shooting service" for scientists and industry are now being put to use in Mexico under the technical assistance program of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.

The founder of the New Zealand government's service, David Cairns, a 36-year-old scientist,

is here on a one-year assignment to set up what is officially called the "biographical service" of a scientific and technical centre Mexico is now establishing with Unesco's co-operation.

Eventually the centre's service

will spread beyond Mexico and be made available to countries throughout Latin America.

Mr. Cairns, who was secretary of the New Zealand National Commission for Unesco, founded his own government's scientific information service in 1944. By 1948, the service was handling 200 requests a month from New Zealand scientists and industrialists.

"My job in Mexico," he said recently, "will be to break down scientific information into a usable form both

ILO Outlines
Transfer of
Europeans

GENEVA.—Plans to transfer European workers to countries needing manpower were outlined recently by the International Labor Organization (ILO), one of the United Nations' specialized agencies.

The situation will be considered at a migration conference to be held in Naples beginning October 2, at which representatives of 30 immigration and

Under the terms of the Unesco

Technical Assistance Agreement, Unesco is sending four experts for a period of two or three years to help in the organization of the centre and to train local personnel. During the first year Unesco is supplying \$15,000 worth of equipment. Four fellowships will be awarded to Mexicans who will visit European centre to gain experience.

The Mexican government will supply the building.

Meanwhile, in an address to the UN Economic and Social Council meeting here, David A. Morse, ILO's director-general, said that ILO is ready to accept the responsibility of a long-range migration program. "We see migration as an important contribution to world economic development and social progress," he said. "Migration is not just a question of transporting people from one country to another. Migration activities have to be closely co-ordinated with employment organization and with employment services."

Mr. Morse said that the present situation urgently requires that one international agency take the lead in developing plans for action in the migration field and in bringing to bear on their practical execution the knowledge and experience of other agencies, each in its special field.

problems cannot even be sensibly discussed.

And it is on this issue that the breakdown has come. The UK government has put forward first one suggestion, then another. Both have been rejected. The Persian government has put forward no proposal of any kind which even begins to take account of this fundamental human question—or how to persuade the only people who can in fact run their nationalized industry to run it.

It is not an issue between the Persian government and the U.K. government. It is not an issue between "nationalization" and "imperialism." It is an issue between a would-be employer—the National Iranian Oil Company—and the staff which they say they wish, and which they certainly need, to employ.

Mr. Stokes has, in a sense, been acting as mediator between the prospective employer and the prospective staff. The prospective employer has refused the perfectly reasonable terms upon which the prospective staff are prepared to work. And that being so, there is no point in discussing other matters.

But what the employer intends to do with an oil industry which has no staff capable of running it is now a question for Doctor Moussadek and his colleagues.


