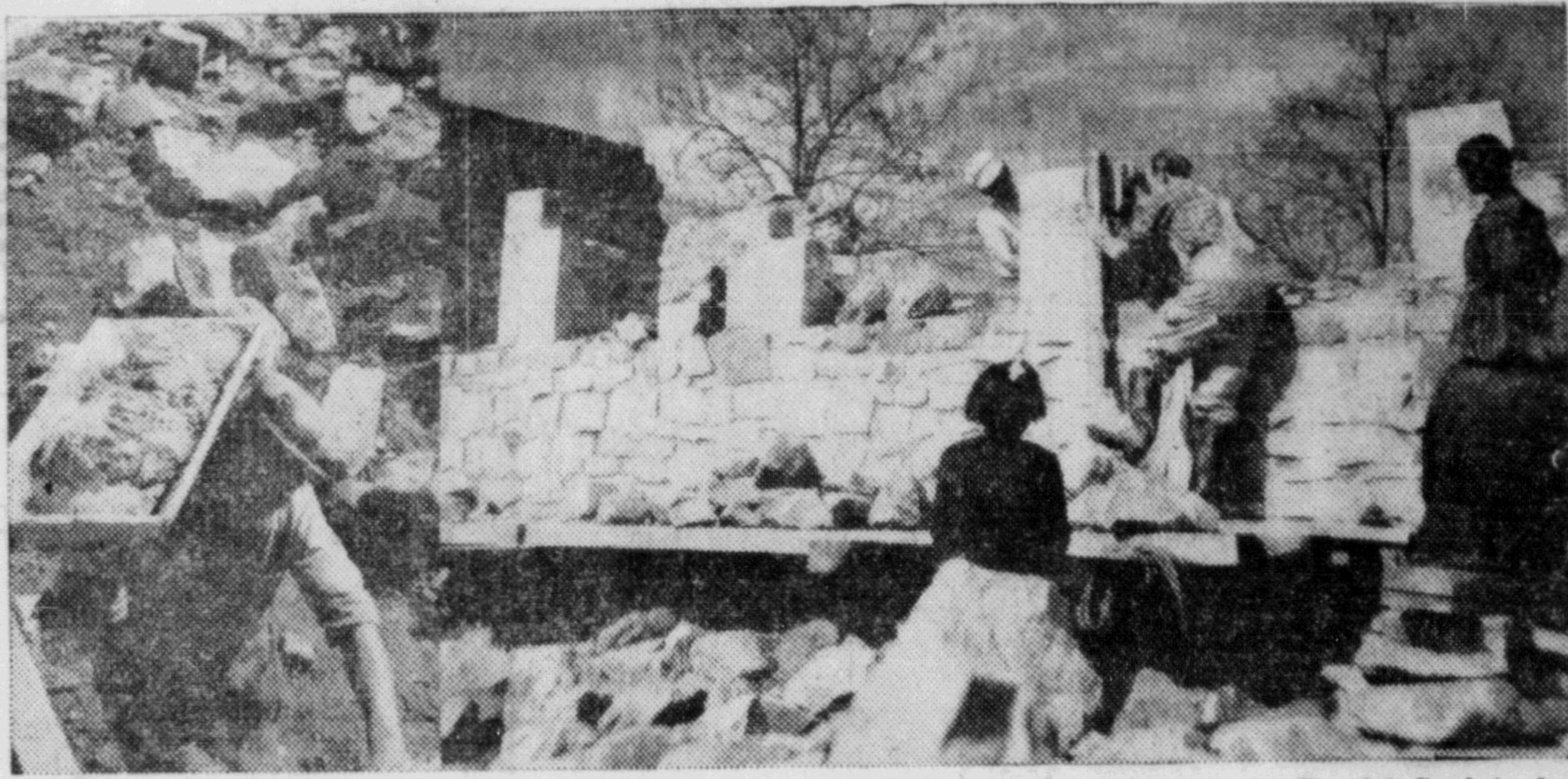


Danish Volunteers Build New School for Greece



The Greek village of Agnadero had no school. As in many other places its schoolhouse was destroyed during the war. Today, thanks to the contributions of Danish school children and of a team of Danish workers, a new schoolhouse is beginning to rise in the war ravaged Greek town.

The initiative was taken by the Danish Society for Reconstruction in War-Ravaged Countries and the Danish National Commission for Unesco. Members of the Danish voluntary team cut stone and mix batches of mortar for the brand-new school which is expected to open some time this summer.

Blackwood on Bridge

Mr. Muzzy yelled with disappointment when the dummy went down in this hand. "We've missed a grand slam, partner," he announced sadly. Mr. Masters felt that he would be perfectly satisfied to miss the grand slam bonus. He only hoped Mr. Muzzy could somehow manage to make six.

Miss Brash opened the king of clubs, hoping her partner would be void in the suit. Mr. Muzzy won with the ace and gave the hand a little study. Then he laid down the ace of hearts and followed with the king of hearts.

Miss Brash ruffed this last trick and led a trump. At this point Mr. Muzzy had three losing hearts left in his hand and only two trumps on the board. There was no getting away from it. He had to lose another heart for down one.

"Nice grand slam, Muzzy," said Mr. Champion, grinning happily. Mr. Muzzy glared. "What lousy luck," he muttered. "Six hearts out and five of them in one hand."

"Of course, after you got the king of clubs opening," Mr. Champion pointed out, "you could have made your bid easily."

"He's right, Muzzy," said Mr. Masters. "What you had to do was to safety-play the hearts."

After winning with the ace of hearts, Mr. Muzzy should have led a small heart—not the king. It would make no difference which opponent won the second heart lead. Whoever it was would lead back trump, which is the best defense.

But Mr. Muzzy would have only two losing hearts instead of three and he would have two trumps on the board to take care of them. The point is that the king of hearts must not be played until the very end of the hand, after trumps have been extracted.

Note particularly that in order to make sure of winning 12 tricks Mr. Muzzy had to give up all chance of winning 13. There's a lesson in that somewhere.

This safety play pops up in all sorts of guises. The main principle involved is this: If the principle cannot be prevented from ruffing, try to arrange your play so that they will ruff your deuces and treys—not your aces and kings.
