Kind and understanding words were addressed to the congregation which overflowed onto the steps and street of the Citadel by Capt. W. C. Poulton, who officiated at the service and spoke words of consolation.

By request a special solo, "Safe in the Arms of Jesus" was sung by Capt. Poulton.

Rev. Fred Antrobus of First United Church said a special prayer.

"Rock of Ages" and "Nearer My God to Thee" were the hymns sung to the piano accompaniment of Miss Clara Pierce.

School Pupils Enjoy Bagpipes

To give the children of Borden Street School an opportunity to become more familiar with bagpipes, Principal J. S. Wilson arranged for William McKay, well-known local piper, to bring his pipes to the school and demonstrate them to the pupils. Mr. McKay arrived yesterday forenoon.

The three senior grades assembled in the music room and Mr. McKay explained the two tenor and the base drone and the need for tuning them properly. He then played a lament, a Scottish folk song, a dance and a march. He was given a great reception by the children.

Later the whole school assembled in the girls' basement and Piper McKay again played selections typical of the different phases of Scottish music.

For one of the marches he had Grade Six march behind him. The children liked "Over the Sea to Skye" as they sing that number.

Two unexpected developments included the fact of one class hearing the unusual music and, taking it for a fire alarm, evacuating the school in almost record time. In a discussion later, two girls said that they had recognized "The Road to the Isles." Their father used to sing it to them and they used to cry!

Piper McKay's visit to the school was much appreciated and will be long remembered. He is to return at a later date when the children will sing some Scottish and other songs for him.
