

State Houses Sell Rapidly

WELLINGTON, N.Z. (P)-Since it announced late last year that state rental houses could be bought by tenants, the New Zealand government has sold homes valued at \$3,000,000. It is continuing to sell them at the rate of 60 a week.

The government is thus implementing its housing policy on "Own Your Own," and at the same time disposing of a liability which was costing the taxpayers about \$700,000 a year.


