Develop Groundhog By Building Railway.

It is safe to say that no corporation would build a railway into the Groundhog coal fields without some Government aid either in cash, in guarantee of bonds or in the way of a grant of coal lands. The cost would be rather heavy, too heavy for a person to take a chance without a guarantee.

The Government will soon own the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway, they say, and they are the only people that can be expected to build the branch line. On Friday night, a resolution, the text of which appears on another page, was proposed by O. H. Nelson and carried unanimously, setting forth reasons why the line should be built and calling on the Government to make the preliminary surveys. For them it means increased business and would be one of the big sources of revenue. Coal is needed badly at this port. Lack of it is retarding development. We need it in large quantities with bunkers here so that ships calling may get fuel supplies.

This is the first step in urging upon the Government the necessity for action. Until results are obtained it will be necessary to keep up the agitation. No matter what government is in power, a line to the Groundhog must be insisted on by the people of Prince Rupert.

Difficult, But Possible.

It is a difficult matter to build a city at Prince Rupert. To grade streets, build permanent sewers, and beautify the city, make permanent sidewalks, make a bridge to Section 2 and keep an up to date city that will be in the running with other cities, there must be permanent industries here. We already have some, more than many cities three times the size of this. Every industry we get helps to lighten the load of taxation, and brings other people here who will help to pay. The larger the population, if it is of the right sort, the better it will be for the city because we shall become modernized and have more of the things which make life worth living.

Wireless messages sent from here to Vancouver or Victoria are picked up first by Triangle Island and then transmitted to Tatoosh or sometimes direct to Gonzales Hill or Point Grey.
