### Nurses' Training School at Hospital.

A nurses' training school is to be established at the General Hospital. There is in charge now a teacher that is equal to any they have in Vancouver or Victoria and most of the opportunities are just as good here as in the larger cities. With a maternity ward in the building, pupil nurses are able to get every branch of training, excepting only that having to do with infectious diseases. It is probable that in the very near future some arrangement will have to be made to include those in the hospital curricula.
