# 140-foot long British-built tug. MUCH TRAVELLED VESSEL

With a crew of 14, the S. D. Brooks' log shows a deep set history—reaching as far away as Jamaica and South America. She was built as a Royal Navy tug "and is meant for this kind of work," said her skipper.

Sometimes hauling rafts of logs as far south as Vancouver, the Brooks usually brings her tows to Captain's Cove across Hecate Straits from Cumshewa Inlet in Ogden Channel where smaller tugs pick them up for the tow to coast mills through the Inside Passage. Due to the rough waters, only one Davis raft is brought across at a time.

"From two to three and one quarter million board feet are in each raft," explained the skipper, who has experienced trouble in northern gales. For this reason weather conditions are checked carefully by Radio Officer D. F. Nicol, and the captain's experienced eye.

The crew is well quartered, with separate messes for officers and men and sleeping cabins. With the warning to "wash your dishes!" at mug-up time, Cook A. Angrasch and "mess boy" J. Wetmore keep the men happy with such tasty pies as pumpkin filling and egg-white icing. Angrasch's skill for variety is challenged in the long slow hauls the tug makes.

Once they have crossed Hecate Straits, Capt. Ohman signals from the pilot house to the engine room under Engineers Alex Munroe and Gordon Sum-

# NOTICE

Regulation Loads and Speed on the Northern Trans-Provincial Highway from GALLOWAY RAPIDS to TYEE

The undersigned, being a person authorized by the Minister of Public Works in writing to exercise the powers vested in the Minister in Part II of the "Highway Act," and being of the opinion that that portion of the Northern Trans-Provincial Highway from Galloway Rapids to Tyee is liable to damage through extraordinary traffic thereon, hereby makes the following Regulation pursuant to Section 35 of the Highway Act.

The following load and speed limitations are imposed on the said highway until further notice:—  
No person shall operate a vehicle over the Northern Trans-Provincial Highway from Galloway Rapids to Tyee having a maximum gross weight or loading in excess of fifty per cent of that allowed in the Regulations made pursuant to Section 36 of the "Highway Act," R.S.B.C. 1948.

The speed limit of vehicles with pneumatic tires is restricted to twenty miles per hour. Vehicles with solid tires are prohibited from using this Highway during such times as this regulation is in force.
