### Jasper Peaks Being Named

#### Heroic Deeds of Canada's Fighting Men Being Perpetuated

OTTAWA—The heroic deeds of five Canadian fighting men are being perpetuated in Canada's largest national park.

According to advice received by the Canadian National Railways from the Canadian Board of Geographical Names, five hitherto anonymous peaks in Jasper National Park have been named after the gallant First World War soldiers, all of whom won the Victoria Cross for their bravery.

The five men are Pte. John Chapman Kerr; Pte. Cecil John Kinross; Lt. G. B. McKeen; Pte. John George Pattison and Sgt. R. L. Zengel, all of Alberta.

Four of them, Lt. McKeen, Sgt. Zengel and Ptes. Kinross and Pattison won their V.C.s for single-handed action in capturing and destroying murderous enemy machine guns and their crews at great personal risk and with the resultant saving of many of their companions' lives. Lt. McKeen and Sgt. Zengel were also awarded the Military Medal for other gallant acts in the field and the former also received the Military Cross.

Pte. Kerr's V.C. came to him when he made a lone charge on the enemy position at Courcellette, France, under heavy fire, at point blank range, shot up the place so badly the enemy thought they were surrounded and gave up. Sixty-two prisoners and 250 yards of trench were captured.

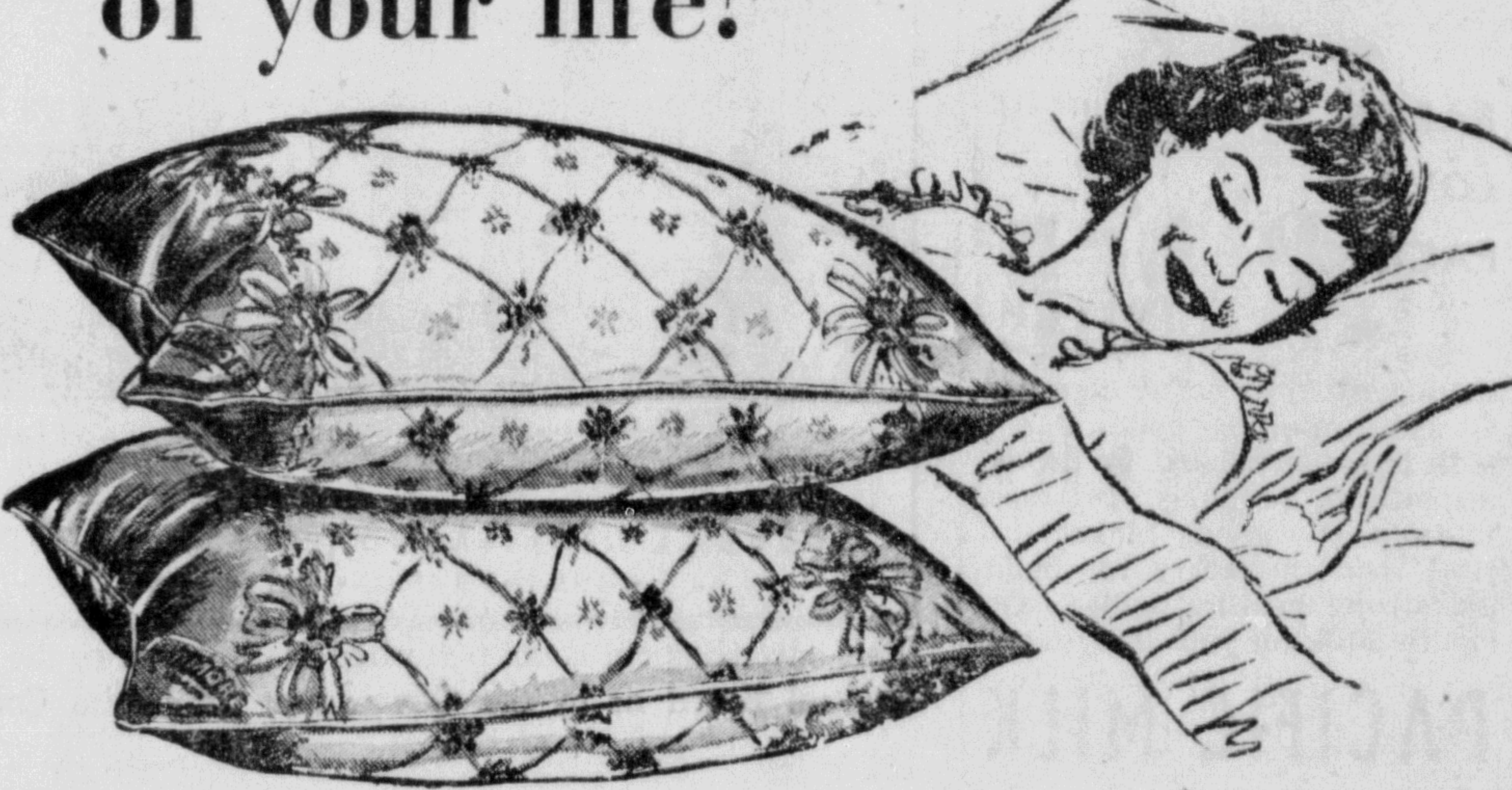

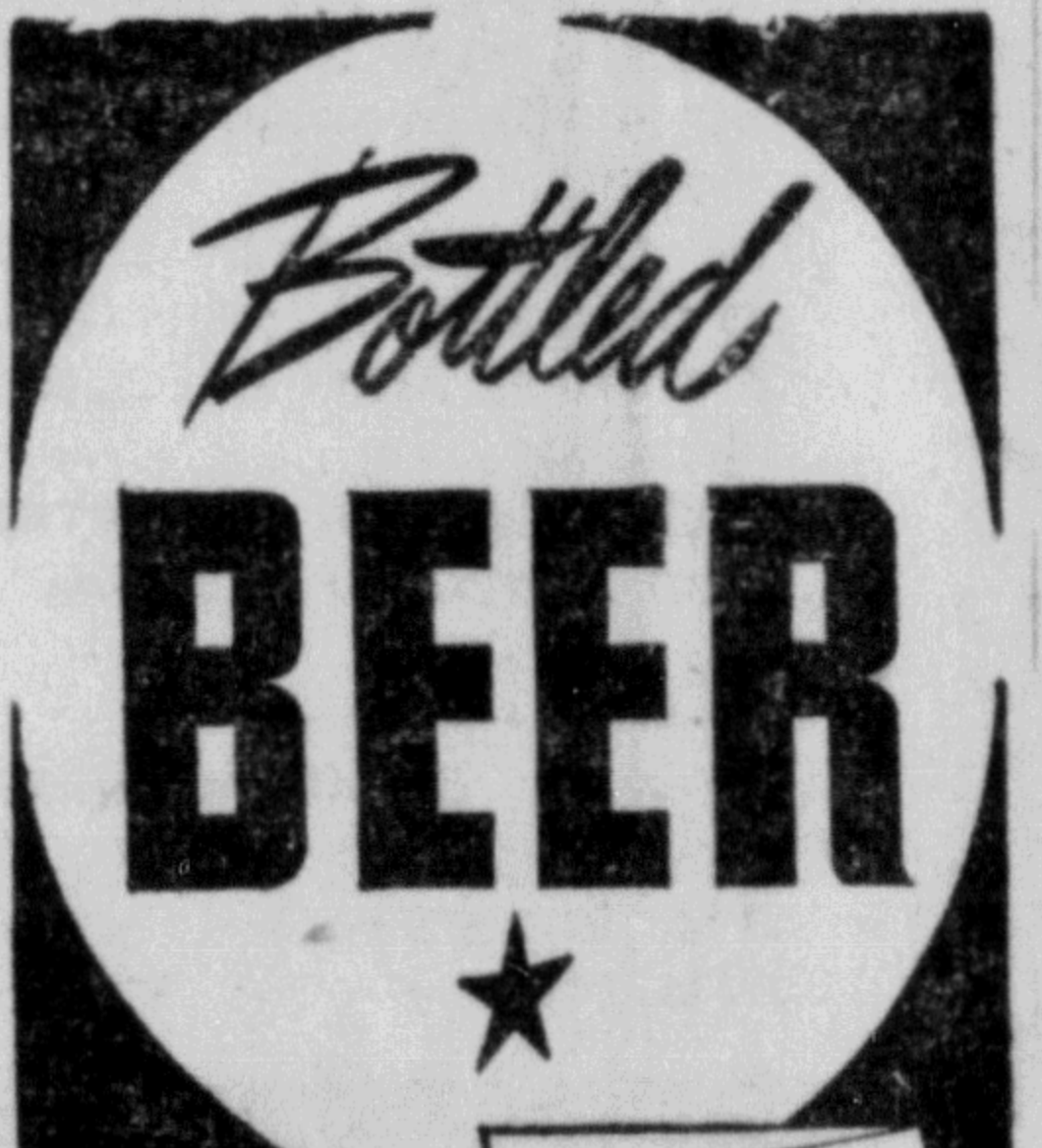

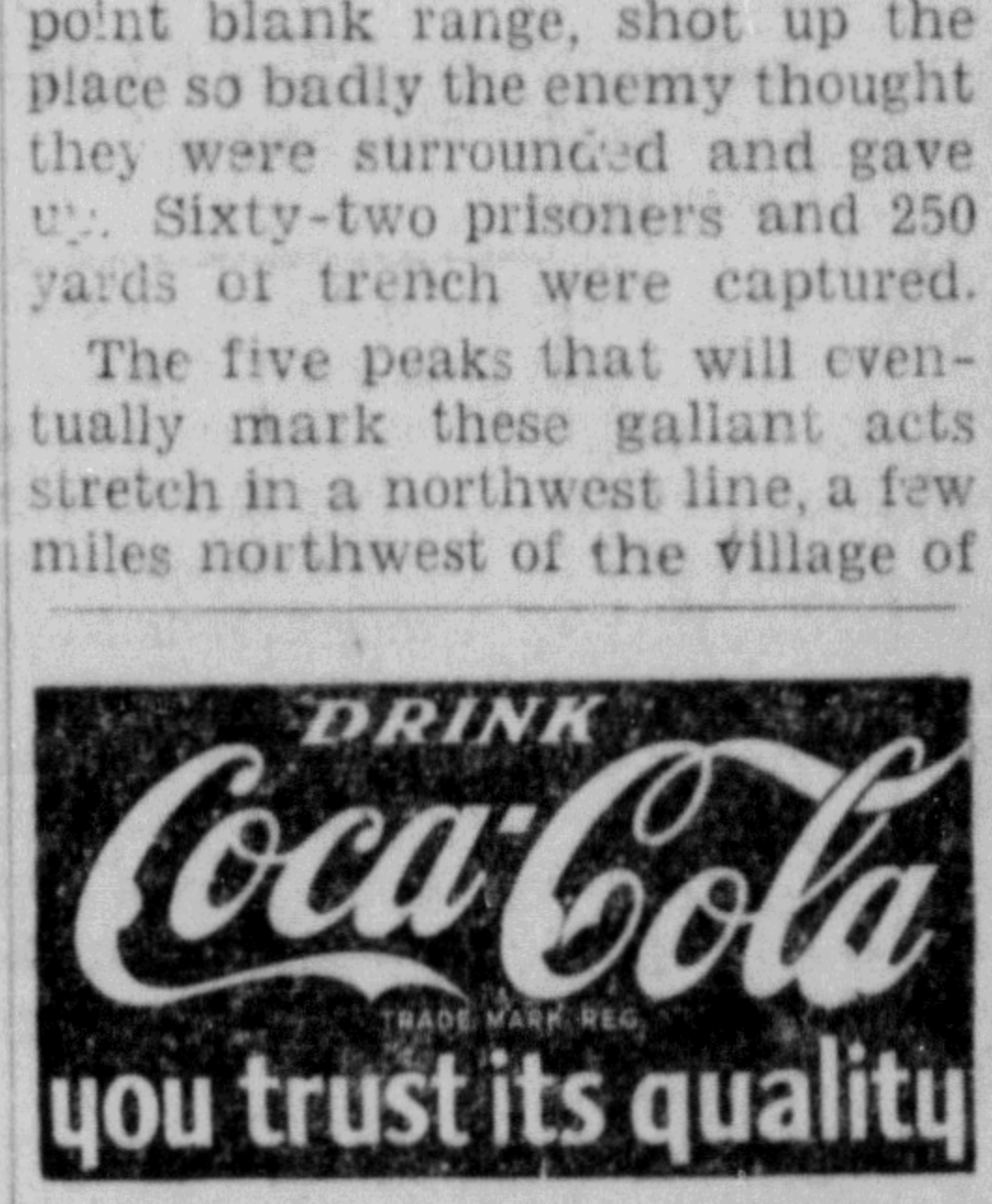
