Blackwood on Bridge

A cross-ruff hand can be a complete cross-ruff, where you never lead a round of trumps but try to make all of your trumps separately; or it can be a partial or modified cross-ruff, where you can afford to pull some but not all of the opponents' trumps.

In the latter case a careful counting of your winners will usually tell you just how many trump leads you can afford to make.

At trick five, then, Mr. Abel laid down the ace of hearts. He then led the ace of spades and followed with a small spade, ruffing with dummy's seven of hearts. Next came the ace of clubs from the board and then a small club which Mr. Abel ruffed in his hand with the six of hearts.

When this held, the contract was assured. All of the remaining trumps in the closed hand and dummy were high. There was no further damage of an overruff and Mr. Abel cross-ruffed the hand out for his 10 tricks.

When you have a cross-ruff type of hand and you can afford one trump lead it is wise to take it.

SPORT SHOTS

Fourteen amateur stars, drawn mainly from the playing fields of Oxford and Cambridge, will sail from Liverpool July 2 for their tour of Canada as representatives of England's famed Maribone Cricket Club. Led by R. W. V. Robins, former England, Middlesex and Cambridge University ace, the tourists will sail in the Empress of France. The eleven will play in Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, St. Catharines, Ont., Winnipeg, Edmonton, Calgary, Vancouver, Victoria and Vernon. For the first time, games against representative Canadian teams are scheduled. They will be played in Toronto, Calgary and Vancouver.

The touring team is regarded as considerably stronger than the eleven, captained by G. C. Newman, which toured Canada in 1937, winning 12 matches and losing one. Six matches were drawn. The defeat was suffered in a two-day match at Toronto when Hon. R. C. Matthews' eleven won by 10 wickets. The players chosen are not only amateur cricketers, but many are also performers of note in other branches of sport. Oxford and Cambridge contribute six men each with Middlesex and Gloucestershire county clubs sending the other two.

NEW YORK

New York Yankees cooled off the Chicago White Sox 2 to 1 Sunday for their third straight victory over the American League leaders but the Sox came back and pounded out a wild 11 to 7 nightcap victory.

Shortstop Phil Rizzuto made an error that left the Sox to score four unearned runs in the eighth inning after two were out.

Boston Red Sox regained possession of third place by twice downing Cleveland 9 to 6 and 8 to 2. Ray Boone, Cleveland shortstop, made four errors, two in the first game accounting for five unearned runs.

Pittsburgh Pirates split a twin bill with Brooklyn Dodgers, the National League leaders. Ralph Kiner hammered out his fifteenth homer of the season with Fete Reiser on base in the eleventh inning of the nightcap to give the Pirates a 5 to 4 victory. Ralph Branca won his fifth game as the Dodgers took the opener 2 to 1.
