Hornet's Nest

Greeted "Christian."

Our correspondent "Christian" seems to have stepped into a nest of hornets when he wrote that letter to the Daily News a few days ago objecting to the Sunday evening concerts and other Sunday activities. There has been a general protest against his attitude, for the writer was not a lady, as some seem to suggest.

Many people who have not written letters have dropped in to express their views on the matter which, speaking generally, are that a Sunday evening concert is just what the people of Prince Rupert have been wishing for but which hitherto they have been unable to enjoy.

We are in accord with those views. We believe that in a place where there are so many homeless people, the time could not be better spent than in attending a Sunday evening concert after the church services. Many will go to the concert who do not wish to go to church.

The News would like to suggest that there will be considerable expense in connection with running a Sunday evening concert and that those attending should go prepared for the collection, just as they would if they went to church. The law does not allow a charge being made, either directly or indirectly, but it does allow a free offering.

The Symphony Orchestra is a local organization and it is deserving of local support. We believe that the concert will be one well worth attending and would urge on the people of the city, who believe in the value of good music as an educative influence, to not only attend the concert tomorrow, but to support it financially.
