

NEW BLOOD IS NEEDED

Hon. William Chisholm, Leader of Opposition, Draws Lesson From West in Appeal to Youthful Nova Scotians

HALIFAX, Jan. 17.—An appeal for participation of youth in public affairs was made in a New Year's message by Hon. William Chisholm, K.C., leader of the Liberal opposition in the Nova Scotia house of assembly. He attributed the political and economic success of Western Canada to the predominance of young men in public life, and stressed that politics was "not a sordid nor undignified occupation, but is among the most honorable of all avocations."

The message was as follows: "There is one wish I have for Nova Scotia as the New Year approaches. It has to do with public affairs, or, as we sometimes say, public life. I hope that this year will see the youth of Nova Scotia becoming more and more interested in public affairs and political questions. Too long has the burden of politics been left to the older men of this province. The time has arrived when we need in Nova Scotia to a far greater extent than has been the case in the past, a more youthful vision. We want and need the young brains of Nova Scotia to tackle the problems facing our public life. I look at Western Canada and I find that the vital thing is their success politically and economically has been the predominance of young men in the public life of those provinces. What I desire most of all is to see our young men and women give a more intensive study to provincial and national problems. To realize that after all, politics is the business of the people; that politics lowers or increases our taxes, keeps peace or makes war. That politics is not a sordid nor undignified occupation, but is among the most honorable of all avocations. Young men and young women, Nova Scotia needs your vigor, your energy, your foresight, your enthusiasm, and your loyalty today more than ever."

"So it is in 1930 I want to see young men and women of this province openly and actively identified with public life, intensively and assiduously devoting some of their surplus time and energy to the problems which face this country. Upon the youth of Nova Scotia will depend very largely our future prosperity and progress. Now is the time to enlist these young men and women in the public service. If we can in this New Year, bring to our public affairs the attention and ability of our young men and women, I vision an enlarged field of endeavor, which they will find attractive and in which they will have a splendid opportunity to render signal public service."

Hon. William Pugsley, minister of public works, announces that a Post Office site for Prince Rupert at the corner of Second Avenue and Sixth Street has been selected. An appropriation of \$50,000 has been secured for a building which will be erected next year, he stated. (The Post Office has not been built yet.)

Governor-General Aids Marketing

Asks for Launching Co-operative Movement Which May Mean Much to Canada and West Indies

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Jan. 17.—For the first time in Jamaica's history a shipment of grapefruit and oranges has been made by the growers' own marketing organization. When the governor-general of Canada and Viscountess Willingdon sailed from Kingston recently, on their return voyage to the Dominion, their departure marked the beginning of an agricultural co-operative movement in the island. Forty cases of fruit packed by the Jamaica Citrus Producers' Association, Ltd., a new co-operative organization, were presented to the vice-regal party for introduction into Canada. Their excellencies had expressed the wish to take samples of Jamaican citrus north with them.

Similar shipments will be made by the organization during the next few months.
