I do not however, feel it inconsistent with my judicial duty to say that if it were within my power to inflict a lesser penalty than the extreme one of forfeiture, I should be disposed to do so, because there are some nitigating circumstances in these cases and there is room for the view that violation of the statute has been occassioned more by misconception of rights than by deliberate intention.
