

Japan Threatens to Take Determined Steps to Protect Its Industry—British Columbia Watches Developments With Much Interest

Effect Upon Pacific Fisheries

TOKYO, Dec. 18:--The Soviet authorities today closed the Vladivostok branch of the Bank of Korea and ordered it to pay about \$1,300,000 in duties. A Japanese Foreign Office statement makes it clear that the government takes strong exception to the action of the Soviet and will not hesitate to adopt determined steps if it is proved that the action will affect Japanese fishery#-

VANCOUVER, Dec. 18:—British ARE GIVEN Columbia salmon packers are watching developments in connection with the Soviet action in closing the Vladivostok branch of the Bank of Korea. The bank was the medium of payment by the Japanconcession in Siberia held since 1904. If the Russian action means nullification of the treaty control of somewhat less than 20% of the world's canned salmon market would pass into Soviet hands.
