

Simple in Principle

While the ramifications of stock exchange trading are intricate and ar-reaching, the basis of its opration is simple. The stock exchange is a market place for the buying and selling of stock. The client places his selling order for stock with his broker. This order 's transported to the "floor" of the exchange, where it is offered for sale by the broker's representative. Should another broker hold a buying order for this stock at market, the sale is completed and recorded by the exchange. 


