## NEWS OF THE MINES AROUND PRINCE RUPERT

### Big Missouri Mill Is Now In Operation—Premier Is Forced to Curtail Shipments to Tacoma Smelter

With the turning on last week of the 100-ton pilot mill and the arrival from Kimberley of Stan Gray for the purpose of making final adjustments and general tuning up, the Big Missouri property at Stewart has passed into the final stage of its development, the results of which will determine whether or not the ore is capable of profitable production. The present position at the property is that there is a large silicified porphyry zone of upwards of 200 feet in which low gold values are found. This zone extends almost the entire length of the property and is interlaced with narrow quartz stringers some of which carry exceptionally high gold values with considerable visible or free gold. A very difficult problem is thus created as, by the very nature of the deposit and structure, sampling is most unsatisfactory. Faced with this condition, the management, which is in the hands of the Consolidated Mining & Smelting Co., had only two alternatives—either to drop the property or to install a pilot mill to enable a more complete test to be made. Having expended a very large amount on development, it was only natural that the latter course should be adopted. The values, while high in spots, are in the aggregate understood to be very low and the operation of the mill will determine whether or not they are commercial. It seems to be generally accepted that, in order to make a profitable operation, mining will have to be carried on on a large tonnage basis or high grade shoot system similar to that in Premier will have to be encountered, this, while not yet disclosed, being geologically possible. Some years ago, an eminent geologist contended that there was a possibility of the Premier zone swinging and following on under the Big Missouri ridge.

## Kelley Logging Company Closes

Operations on Queen Charlottes Resumed With Expectation of Resuming Next Year.

The T. A. Kelley Logging Co. closed down operations at its logging camp at Selwyn Inlet, Queen Charlotte Islands, late in December with the expectation of resuming work in February. Members of the logging crew arrived in Prince Rupert from the islands on the steamer Prince John yesterday.
