Village Club Presents Report Covering Past Two Years

TERRACE, Jan. 31.—A town meeting was held in the Legion Hall Wednesday, J. K. Gordon presiding over a good attendance. The clerk to the municipality reported on the work done during the past two years and the commissioners were thanked for their efforts.

Several matters of local importance were discussed and the commissioners were asked to take action in respect of the disposal of garbage and night soil and the inspection of chimneys.

The commissioners were also asked to institute a volunteer firefighting brigade.

The report of the clerk, H. Halliwell was as follows:

"I have been asked to provide a brief statement of the work accomplished by the commissioners since the incorporation of the village, which took place in December, 1927.

"Work has been done along many obvious to all that more has been accomplished than would have been the case if we had not had home

"First of all, the commissioners Ultra-Violet SUN RAY had to apply themselves to the task of setting up the machinery of aditself, involved quite a considerable amount of thought and consideraessary stationery designed and provided and the necessary bylaws thought out and adopted. 
"An attempt was made to remedy the condition of Kalum Street near the park during flood times by placing a culvert under the roadway, and, though not entirely adequate, this has had a very beneficial ef-

"Two or three sections of side walks have been put down to the greater comfort of residents and visitors.

"During the past year the greatest effort of the commissioners has been in connection with the acquirement and development of the local water system. After long and intricate dealings with the water rights branch the municipality at last received a conditional licence for the storage, distribution and sale of water, and steps were at once taken to improve the water supply.
