## Cow's Stomach 'Window' Helps Study of Diet

Pennstate Jessie II, Lets Scientists Observe How She Digests Her Food

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., Aug. 7:—The mantle of Pennstate Jessie, the famous cow which lived four years at Pennsylvania State College with a "window" in her stomach, had fallen on another.

Again selecting a Holstein, scientists christened her Pennstate Jessie II with a painless operation in the college veterinary hospital. A local anesthetic was used and beyond shaking her head several times the heifer gave no signs of being aware that anything out of the ordinary was taking place.

The opening of the largest stomach is kept closed with a special rubber plug which can be removed when scientists wish to study the bacterial action in Jessie's dinner. The studies interrupted by the death of the original Pennstate Jessie now may be resumed. They open speculative features which may initiate an entirely new sphere of investigation in dietetics.

It has been found that the bacterial count content in a cow's stomach changes as new elements are introduced to her food, new bacteria appearing and developing as the new rations were continued, and disappearing when the elements are withdrawn.

How these bacteria originate, where they come and how the findings may apply to humans and influence the general practice of dietetics, comprise a field of large potentiality. The fact that an organism was found in the stomach of Jessie I, which manufactured vitamin B when there was none in the ration, leads to the belief that special bacteria may be derived from other organisms in the stomach, or are developed from existing form when they are required.

## Park Your Pup Upon the Roof Hotel Invites

LONDON, Aug. 8:—A parking place for pups has been built on the roof of one of London's West End hotels. The British dog is generally supposed to be the best cared for canine in the world and this latest comfort seems to confirm the supposition. A uniformed page is assigned to feed, water, and watch the dogs which are left while masters and mistresses attend the performance.  
 All the large department stores of London have an attendant in the entrance hall to stand guard over the dogs that are left while the owners shop. The dogs' leashes are hung on a series of hooks in front of which are placed little pans of water. There are few restaurants, even in the smartest dining districts where dogs are forbidden. Waiters cheerfully step over tails and legs that protrude from beneath table cloths, and many hat checkrooms have complete dog checking facilities.

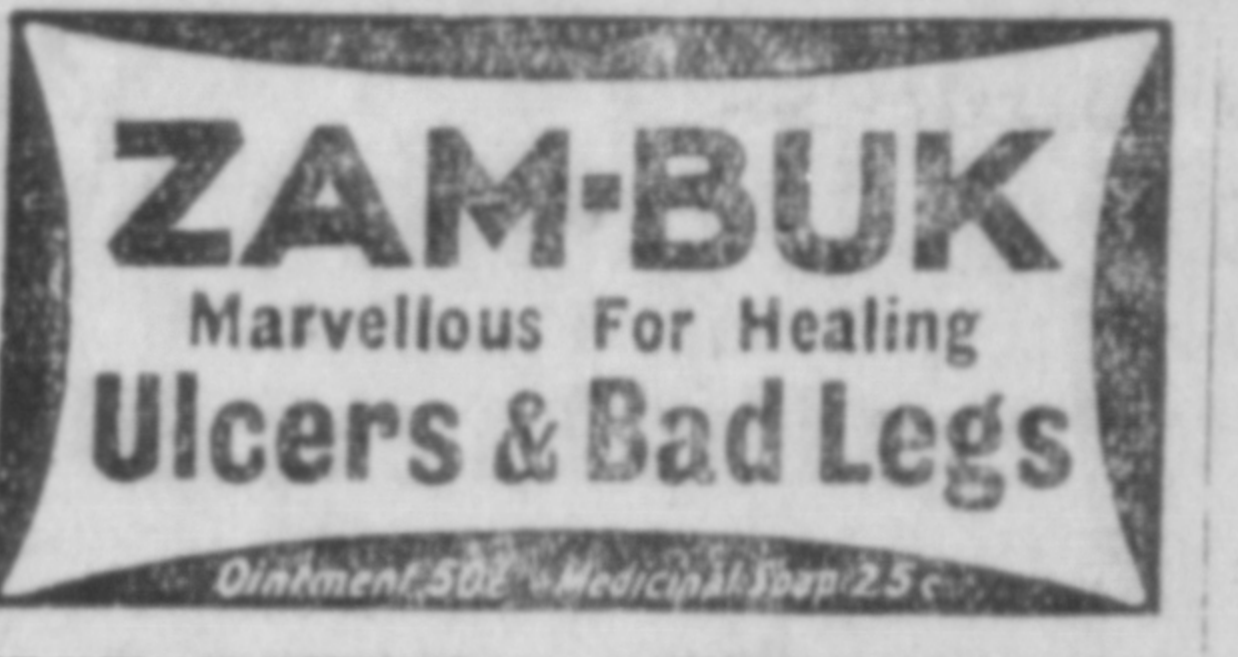
