

SPORT CHAT

One of the most successful British boxers that have come to America is Jack Berg. Known as the "Whitechapel Whirlwind," and as "Kid" Berg has had a series of successes on this side of the water. He is a willing mixer and a hard hitter. Last night he beat Kid Chocolate, who had never been beaten as an amateur or professional.

Berg had about a 10-pound advantage over the Cuban boxer and entered the ring a slight favorite. Berg is considered the chief contender for the lightweight title now held by Al Singer.

Local athletes are already getting into trim for the Labor Day sports in this city. There are some who have been in steady training all summer and they are looking forward to the Labor Day celebrations to provide the big wind-up to the racing season. One of these is Philip Edgecumbe, the Regiment half-back. Bob Irvine is another, while a third is Billy Vance.

Why has Ed. Smith who used to thrill the stands with his pole vaulting at the school games a couple of years back given up this form of athletics? Light, fast and with a fine co-ordination of jump lift, pull and throw, Eddie always took the eye at the pole-vaulting especially and it would be too bad if he did not concentrate on it again.

Alex. Walters is another young athlete who shows great promise in pole vaulting. He has done nine feet, three inches, at times and this is sufficient indication of his possibilities.

An additional item of interest would be the pole-vaulting of Fred Wardroper. This youngster who cannot be more than 3 feet, 6 inches high, and who weighs about 55 pounds, does 5 feet 3 inches in the pole vault regularly. He is a natural vaulter though his size would indicate that the jumping stick would be a big enough load for him to carry without trying to use it as a lever to jump eighteen inches higher than himself.

The performance of Swedish athletes and the Swedish system of drill have done much to make Sweden an important factor in all athletic circles. Their aim is not so much to develop super-athletes as to give everyone encouragement to take part in athletics of some form or another and so reap the rare benefits of health and vigor to be derived from participation in sports generally.

One of the features of the Swedish athletics is the establishment of a competition for the Swedish Merit Badge. This test includes five groups of events. In each event a competitor must reach a set standard to qualify for a Swedish Merit badge. In the Scandinavian countries there are over twenty thousand who have qualified and among these is the Crown Prince of Sweden.

The Viking Athletic Club of Vancouver conducts competitions along these lines and such success has crowned their activities that they have made the trials open.
