Mr. and Mrs. Olof Hanson, who have been on a trip as far East as Chicago and Toronto, returned to the city on the Catala last evening.

Ald. W. M. Brown, who went south to attend the meeting of the British Columbia executive of the Canadian Trades Congress with the provincial cabinet in Victoria, returned to the city on the Catala yesterday afternoon.

T. Van Dyk, district game warden with headquarters in Prince Rupert, arrived in the city on yesterday afternoon's train from the interior and went out again on this morning's train, being en route to Vancouver on official business.

Among loans made by the Land Settlement Board in 1929 was one for \$500 payable semi-annually for 25 years to E. K. Erickson of Prince George. Hon. William Atkinson, minister of agriculture, answered in the legislature to questions asked by A. Wells Gray, M.L.A. for New Westminster.

With a fair-sized passenger list, Union steamer Catala, Capt. A. E. Dickson, arrived in port at 5:15 last evening from the south and sailed at 8 p.m. for Anyox, Stewart, and other northern points, whence she will return here tomorrow morning and sail at 1:30 p.m. for Vancouver and waypoints.

H. F. Kergin, M.L.A. for Atlin, asked in the legislature if it was the intention of the department of mines to establish a government smelter and, if so, when, where and for what class of ores. Mr. Kergin has also asked if the department has purchased any ores and, if so, what for, in what amount, at what cost and from whom. The minister of mines gave negative answers.

George Clothier, resident engineer for the southwestern mineral survey district, with headquarters in Vancouver, and formerly located here in a similar capacity, addressed a public meeting under the auspices of the British Columbia Chamber of Mines in Vancouver last Friday evening. Tomorrow A. D. Cruikshank of the Western Canada Airways, Ltd., and known here, will address a joint luncheon in Vancouver of the British Columbia Chamber of Mines, Institute of Mining & Metallurgy and the mining bureau of the Vancouver Board of Trade on the use of aircraft for prospecting and mining.
