MONTREAL, Jan. 28. - A plea for conservation of Canada's forest lands was made by Hon. Charles Stewart, minister of the interior. in an address before the annual convention here of the Canadian Forestry Association. "I like to think of forestry in the same category as any other Chairman, Ontario Division, Ca- industry, like mining and fishing, and as a basic industry," said the minister. "During the past ten years our pace

has been rapid in preservation and kindred matters, and, as far as Ottawa is concerned, we are not going to lose interest there."

Mr. Stewart explained that he was trying to enlarge the activities of the government in this direction, particularly in a technical way, for, if the country was to carry on in future, the interests of Canada must be guarded scientifically and in a
