A similar seizure was made during the summer at Notre Dame du Lac, where a fake bottling plant with up-todate electric machinery was in operation. At each of these seizures several thousand gallons of liquor were confiscated.

Police patrols directed by the commission watch both banks of the St. Lawrence River, and during the season when the river is open, patrol boats are continually on the river itself. That these patrols are determined to let nothing escape them is shown by the fact that one of them was among the last boats to come up to Quebec before the closing of
