BOOTLEGGERS FARE BADLY

Business Was Not Good in Quebec Province During Past Year

QUEBEC, Feb. 3.—Bootleggers fared badly in the province of Quebec during 1929. They had nearly 50,000 gallons of contraband liquor seized by the Quebec Liquor Commission, two schooners have been confiscated, and a number of the bootleggers themselves are at present languishing under lock and key, or striving to recover from the effects of a heavy fine.

The principal hauls made by the commission in the course of their vigorous campaign against the contrabandists last season were at Tadoussac in July, when 10,000 gallons of contraband liquor were seized; from a schooner in Quebec harbor a month later 5,000 gallons; while perhaps the most startling event of all was the seizure of a distillery operating at the Arena where imitations of well-known brands of whiskies were being made. A similar seizure was made during the summer at Notre Dame du Lac, where a fake bottling plant with up-to-date electric machinery was in operation. At each of these seizures several thousand gallons of liquor were confiscated.

Police patrols directed by the commission watch both banks of the St. Lawrence River, and during the season when the river is open, patrol boats are continually on the river itself. That these patrols are determined to let nothing escape them is shown by the fact that one of them was among the last boats to come up to Quebec before the closing of navigation.

The Quebec Liquor Commission here has what is virtually a museum of the art of bootlegging.
