BIG DRIVE FOR ATHLETIC CLUB

Tuesday Next Set as Day for
Going out After Funds for
Prince Rupert Amateur
Athletic Ass'n.

A drive for funds in connection with the newly formed Prince Rupert Amateur Athletic Association was arranged for at the meeting last night. It will take place on Tuesday of next week and all workers and others interested in forwarding the aims of the association are asked to meet on Monday evening at 8 in the Board of Trade rooms in order to organize the campaign.

The drive is not so much for members as for subscriptions towards the building and equipment for which approximately \$2,000 is needed.

A rough estimate submitted by Mitchell & Currie at a meeting held last night in the Board of Trade rooms showed that nearly \$1,400 would be required to fit up a proper permanent dressing room with stair leading to the main exhibition building and with two showers and hot water heating apparatus.

The amount of apparatus secured will depend largely upon the funds collected, but the whole expenditure in connection with the building and equipment should not be less than \$2,000 in order to give the new association a good start.

It is the intention to canvass every person in the city that can be reached and to try to secure the full amount needed so that there may be no debt hanging

over the association to handicap its work.

Plans are to be prepared of the new improvements and everything will be ready to go right ahead just as soon as the money is forthcoming.

JUNEAU HAS 'BLIND PIGS'

So Says Grand Jury Which
Recommends That They
Be Suppressed.

Juneau, Oct. 22.—The Grand Jury which has just been discharged in its report says as follows:

"Our investigations justify the belief that many of the so-called 'soft drink' resorts now being operated in the city of Juneau are what are known as 'blind pigs'; that intoxicating liquors are being or have been sold in them to the detriment and injury of the city and community.

"We further find that, with but few exceptions, these 'blind pigs' are owned and operated by foreigners who are not in sympathy with our laws and institutions; that they are here and engaging in unlawful business for the sole purpose of illicit gain; that many of them are on record as having violated the laws of our country, having been previously convicted of such violation.

"We, therefore, recommend that in future, prison terms be included in the punishment meted out to these offenders of our laws for the reason that fines are not adequate to the magnitude of the majority of the offenses, their illicit business having been of

such financial profit that even the maximum fine is of small consequence to them.

"We further recommend that the immigration authorities be urged to investigate existing conditions with the view of deporting to the various countries from whence they came the many aliens who are defying the laws of our country by engaging in illegal and unlawful pursuits."
