The Prince Albert is scheduled to sail for Stewart at seven o'clock this evening.

Mr. and Mrs. Grant Mayhood are returning to Stewart on the Prince Albert this evening after spending a few weeks in this city.

An addition is being built to No. 2 G. T. P. shed at the Grand Trunk wharves in order to provide more accommodation for freight passing through.

The little son of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Selig underwent an operation at the hospital recently and is not expected to be around for some time.

A meeting of members of the Federated Labor Party and independent members will be held in the O. B. U. Hall, corner of Sixth Avenue and Fulton Street, Sunday evening, October 26, at 8 o'clock.

Miss Edythe Stewart of the Prince Rupert General Hospital staff, who has been visiting in the east, has returned to Vancouver. After visiting in Victoria she is returning by the C. P. R. boat today.

Last night was the coldest yet this fall and there was a beautiful display of northern lights in the sky. The frost caused most people to start their furnaces and appear this morning in their overcoats.

Lieut.-Col. C. W. Peek, in company with Lieut.-Col. W. W. Foster, recently visited the new soldier settlement at Merville, near Courtenay, Vancouver Island, and went as far as Campbell River on a hunting trip.

Beverages in local bars and wholesale houses are to undergo the alcoholic test at regular periods after this. Also bread weight is to be tested as well as coal. Such were the instructions issued to the police at the Police Commission meeting yesterday.

The hull of the U. S. lighthouse tender Cedar, which is being overhauled at the local drydock, has been scraped and painted. Now her plates and side keels are being put in shape. It is expected that another three or four days will see her ready for the water again.

Mr. Fletcher, postoffice inspector, will be here about the end of the month, it is expected.
