LOST LEG IN WINCH

J. W. Moorehouse, Well Known Pioneer of City, Suffered Severe Accident

J. W. Moorehouse, well known pioneer resident of this city, was the victim of a severe accident about 4:30 yesterday afternoon on the local waterfront when his right leg was drawn into the winch of his fish packer Ogden and mangled to such an extent that amputation of the member five inches above the knee was necessitated.

The Ogden was moored at the Edward Lipst (Prince Rupert) Ltd. wharf when the accident occurred. Mr. Moorehouse and Capt. Henry White, skipper of the Ogden, were engaged in loading supplies on the vessel for delivery to the Langara Fishing & Packing Co.'s cannery at New Massett.

The Ogden was formerly the halibut boat Lincoln which, it will be remembered, blew up about four years ago at a local oil wharf, the owner at that time, Capt. Martin Potland, being killed. After that accident, the vessel was taken over by Mr. Moorehouse and E. H. Simpson, manager of the Langara Fishing & Packing Co., renamed the Ogden and operated by them since in packing fish for the Massett cannery.

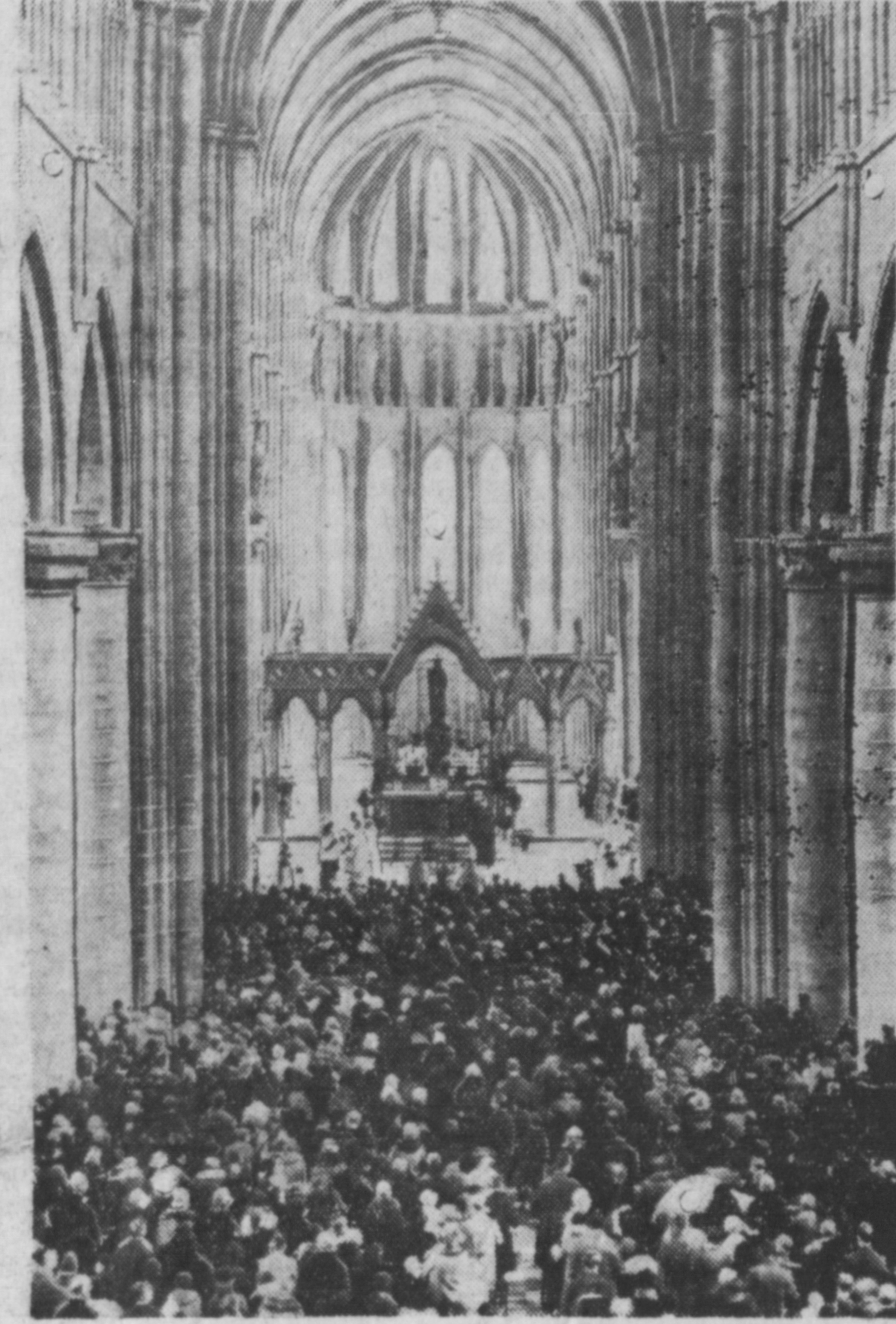
