WILL CLOSE DOWN CAMP

Bernfeld Logging Co. to Cease Operations at Skidegate Following Government Order

Having been prohibited by the provincial government from shipping rived spruce into the United States on the ground that it is not a manufactured product, it is understood that the Bernfeld Logging Co., which has been operating in Skidegate Inlet, Queen Charlotte Islands, is to close down its camp there. The Bernfeld Co. in the past brought its rived spruce from Roumania. The company claims, however, that the Queen Charlotte Island spruce is far superior to that of Roumania besides being more accessible.

The Prince Rupert Board of Trade and other Northern B.C. bodies have taken up the case with a view to having special permission granted to export this rived spruce.
