Starts Today.

Throughout Canada the campaign for the last Victory Loan commences today. Committees have been or are being organized and a group of canvassers will be out to call on all residents to lay before them the claims of this national loan. No matter how we feel about the political situation, the war work must be completed. Cash is necessary and as it is impossible to go outside for money, the only thing to do is to borrow it from our own people.

The advantage of borrowing at home is that the interest is paid here and spent here instead of going to London or New York to enrich the people there. It is a great thing to do our own financing. The bonds pay five and a half per cent interest and are easily exchanged for goods of any kind if it is not the intention to keep them.
