on charges of receiving stolen pro- Official Blue Book Issued Today Contains Correspondence—Church Is Charged With Interfering In Domestic Politics

> LONDON, June 5:-An official blue book published today contains correspondence between the British government and the Holy See concerning a dispute in Malta in which the Vatican is charged with acting in a manner "which constitutes nothing less than a claim to interfere with the domestic politics of a colony." The trouble arose 18 months ago when the Prime Minister of Malta, Lord Strickland, himself a Catholic, prevented ecclesiastical authorities from transferring a Franciscan priest, who was a native Maltese, to a Sicilian monastery against his will. Maltese Catholics were then forbidden by churchmen to vote for the government party in the forthcoming elec-
