Concrete walk, 10 feet wide, north side of Fraser Street, Fifth Street o Sixth Street. Wooden walk, 8 feet wide, north

side of Second Avenue, Second Street to McBride Street. Wooden walk, 8 feet wide, west side of McBride Street, Third Av-

enue to First Avenue. Asphaltic walk 10 feet wide, west ide of Fifth Street, Third Avenu to Fraser Street.

Asphaltic walk, 10 feet wide, west Perfect dyeing side of Sixth Street, Third Avenue to Fraser Street.

Asphaltic walk, 10 feet wide, east ide of Sixth Street, Fraser Street to ane north of Fraser Street. Asphaltic walk, 10 feet wide,

Seventh Streets.

Construction Bylaws

The local improvement construcon bylaws were as follows: Asphaltic sidewalk, 17 feet wide,

north side of Third Avenue, Second Street to McBride Street. Asphaltic sidewalk, 12 feet wide,

south side of Third Avenue, Seventh Street to Eighth Street. Asphaltic sidewalk, 12 feet wide, north side of Third Avenue, Sev-

onth to Eighth Streets. Asphaltic sidewalk, 17 feet wide, east side of Second Street, Second

Avenue to Third Avenue. Asphaltic sidewalk, 10 feet wide, east side of First Street, Second Avenue to Third Avenue.

Asphaltic sidewalk, 17 feet wide, south side of Second Avenue, Third Street to McBride Street.

Ald. Pullen thought that it was regrettable that, now provision was being made for the replacement of old walks in most parts of the gap on the south side of Third Avenue from Brooksbank's building to McBride Street on which, evidently, nothing could be done.

After some discussion as to this gap, it was decided, on motion of Ald. Rudderham, that a new initliative bylaw be prepared providing for a wooden sidewalk on this section. It was felt by the council that the property owners concerned might assume the cost of such a sidewalk.

With reference to the south side of Second Avenue from Third Street to McBride Street, Ald. Rudderham


