

Patsy Shanahan to Come up at The Assizes Now on in Alaskan Town.

Reports brought from Ketchikan state that there have been no new developments in the Ragar murder case. Patsy Shanahan, accused of the crime, is now in the jail and it is expected that he will come up for trial this week before the assizes that are now

Shanahan is said to have been omewhat unbalanced for some time and it is stated that he has made threats against several of the officers of the law. in fact, four years ago he was recommended for the asylum, but nothing came of it.

On Thursday he went out with two loaded Colt automatics on a killing mission and calmly shot Deputy United States Attorney Steve Ragar in the main street. He then went to his room in the hotel where he was followed by the U. S. marshal and two constables. Fearing a desperate character, one of the police took a chair and mounted to the transom and covered him with his revolver and told him to come to the door where the other two took him. On being told he was under arrest he did not even ask why.

If his insanity is proven he will probably escape jail, but at any rate, the worst he can get is life imprisonment, as capital punishment has been abolished in Alaska.


