TELEPHONES ARE NEEDED

J. C. Brady, M. P. Tells House of Commons of This District's Wants

"This vote affords me the opportunity to bring to the attention of the minister the grave importance of federal telephone communication in Northern British Columbia and particularly in the constituency of Skeena," said J. C. Brady, M. P. for Skeena, in the House of Commons at Ottawa, recently. "I may not have another opportunity to mention this fact, and as it is a very important subject I ask the indulgence of the committee at the present time. I have placed before the minister for his consideration three new lines which are absolutely essential. One is from Houston to the Owens Lake Mining and Developing property. Twenty-six miles of new road have been constructed by the provincial government and by the Owens Lake mining interests. The old telephone line went along the old road which led to Nadina; this road is not being used to-day. There is an urgent request for the construction of a new telephone line to meet the requirements of this large and important mine which employs over fifty men. I have given information, which the minister no doubt has, regarding the importance of this line, and I trust he will see to it that this matter will receive immediate consideration. "The next point I wish to bring to the attention of the minister is the fact that for three years I have been asking for the construction of a telephone line from Colleymount to North Francois Lake. In order to show the seriousness of the situation in that section of the country I will read part of a letter which should be of profound interest to the minister, and to the hon. members in this house. There is no telephone system in the whole district. There is a farmers' institute consisting of 27 farmers with their wives and children. These people have to travel 40 miles, when emergencies arise, in order to get in touch with a doctor. The letter I have in my hand has to deal with the conditions that exist in that section.

Dear Sir: "Again we wish to call to your attention the vital subject of a telephone for Colleymount post office. We have been told by the forestry department of British Columbia that we could have a lookout station situated on Colley mountain, provided the Dominion government would give telephone connection to Colleymount and community. By so doing a vast amount of valuable timber may be saved from destruction by forest fires every year, and the residents be helped out of their great handicap. "To show what our people here are up against, I may refer to the very sad death of the three year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Roberts which occurred here recently from spinal meningitis. Due to the lack of a telephone in our community it was necessary to take this very sick child to Burns Lake for treatment, a distance of forty miles. I am sure you will agree with us that when our institute has a membership of twenty-seven we feel entitled to a telephone. "It is the belief of the people in this community that had there been telephone communication immediate steps could have been taken to save the life of this child. The child died before medical assistance could reach Burns Lake. I wish to say to hon. gentlemen that I am sorry to hinder at this late hour the progress of the estimates, but this is a matter of such importance that I feel it is worthy of your special consideration, and now that you are in possession of the fact you will realize the importance of assisting these people. They are asking only for one of the essential things of life, telephone communication, and I cannot see why they should not receive it. The third line is between Bickle and Grassy Plains. I trust these matters will receive the sympathetic consideration of the minister and that steps will be taken to have these lines installed. Will the minister promise to give this his attention?" Minister of Public Works Elliott said that every request Mr. Brady had made would receive most sympathetic consideration.
