KOLCHAK GETS BIG CREDITS FROM BANKERS

Great Britain Financed Russia in Immense Sums Since 1917; International Bankers Have Confidence in Admiral.

WINTER SEASON HELPS SOVIET IN PETROGRAD

(Special by G. T. P. Telegraphs.) LONDON, Oct. 30.— Cecil Harmsworth, under Secretary for Foreign Affairs, replying to Josiah Wedgwood in the House of Commons said that Constantine Nabokoff, who represented Russia at London, had received from Great Britain between March 1917 and March 1919 when payments ceased, more than \$200,000,000. Sabin, who succeeded Naboroff, now occupies the Embassy as representative of Admiral Kolchak. A wireless message received from Moscow states that international bankers have advanced Admiral Kolchak credits amounting to \$50,000,000.

LONDON, Oct. 30.—Winter moving southwards from the Arctic regions, is now coming to the aid of the Bolshevik troops in Petrograd, and the ability of General Yudenich to capture the former Russian capital, before cold weather put an end to his campaign seems doubtful. The Soviet forces south of Petrograd appear to be in a position to prolong the defence of the city for an indefinite period, which fact seems to have upset the plans of the Anti-Bolshevik leaders.
