Mr. Lord claimed that the new system, which was already declared to be in operation, would work a hardship on the fisherman, preventing him from moving from one water waving. It would be the judicial thing not to enforce them during the coming season.

Mr. Lord asked for a resolution of protest.

Ald. S. D. Macdonald said he appreciated the way in which the case for the fishermen had been stated. He believed the fishermen were all against the proposals of the government. He thought they should ask that the regulations be withheld and moved a resolution asking for

Ald. Brown feared a monopoly with which he would not be in accord. He seconded the motion.

Ald. Pillsbury said he would like to have heard the cannerymen's side. In justice to them, he would like to hear a little more about the question.

Ald. Linzey thought the motion would cover what they wanted. It asked for delay. The fishermen were as one in opposing the regulations and he thought they should ask that they be withheld.

Alderman Rudderham said the question was important. The whole scheme, he thought, was framed in the south, and he thought they should ask to have a commission appointed to inquire into it and present their findings.

Ald. Collart also was against jumping at conclusions. He thought they should ask for delay.

The vote was unanimous in favor of asking the chief commissioner to withhold the regulations for the coming season.
